GREENSBORO—A Black Power Forum sponsored by the National Student Association of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro begins today.

Topics for the forum, which runs through Friday, will be: "Black Power, Past and Present" by Dr. J. H. Brewer, instructor in Afro-American Studies, North Carolina College in Durham.

"The Ghetto" by Caubert Jones, instructor in Afro-American Studies, North Carolina College.

"Black Power and the Self-Image of the Negro" by Howard Fuller, lecturer in the School of Social Work here and director of community organization of the North Carolina Fund.

Panels will be from 2-4 p.m., lectures from 8-9 p.m. Discussions will follow.

There will be an opportunity for questions from the floor during both the panel discussions and lecture periods.

The Forum is open to students and faculty.

Finance Committee Sends Out Unfavorable Phone Bill Request

The Finance Committee of Student Legislature passed out unfavorably Tuesday a \$477.39 appropriation to pay for Student Government phone bills unless certain steps are taken to correct the situation.

The committee will make a special report to Student Legislature on the situation Thursday.

The unfavorable report serves only as a recommendation to Legislature, having no effect on the actual bill.

SG was appropriated \$445.12 for phone calls last year but had a bill of \$922.50 for that period.

The committee voted to request Student Body President Bob Travis to appoint a special committee to look into the problem and see how it can be alleviated.

They also will ask the Attorney General's staff to review the situation and see if all the phone calls were made for Student Government business.

The committee also passed out favorably an appropriation of \$197.10 to the Special Com-

mittee on General College Reform, chaired by John McMurray, SP legislator from Hinton James.

The committee was established several weeks ago by Travis to improve the quality of education at UNC and to investigate the General College requirements.

A bill to give \$500 to the Board of Governors of the Men's Residence College and \$250 matching funds to the residence colleges for establishing college radio stations was tabled for discussion next week.

Part of the money would be used to buy tape recorders to tape broadcasts for use by all stations.

Bronze Star Awarded Grad

The Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" was presented posthumously on Tuesday to 2nd Lt. Richard S. Johnson, Jr., U.S. Marine Corps, who was killed in Vietnam on March 26, 1967.

Lt. Johnson had been a Morehead Scholar and NROTC midshipman battalion commander here. He was a 1966 graduate of the University.

Receiving the medal for her husband was Mrs. Johnson, the former Penny Scovil of Raleigh. Mrs. Johnson now makes her home in Chapel Hill.

The citation, which was read at noon on Fetzler Field, praised Lt. Johnson for his "professional ability and fearless composure under fire." It was signed by Charles F. Baird, acting Secretary of the Navy.

Col. Richard S. Johnson, father of the deceased, now stationed at Camp LeJeune, made the presentation of awards to the widow. Besides the Bronze Star, Lt. Johnson also received the Purple Heart, the National Defense Medal and the Vietnam Service Medal.
