a result they played each other Wednesday for the title. It went to the wire but Ehringhaus A Blue downed A Gold 2-1 for the residence hall handball title.

John Yancey took the singles in three games for A Gold, but the doubles team of Steve Wilson and Burt Dean edged Rudisill and Wilson, in three games and Tom Buskey and David Lemonds likewise followed suit against Stan Lemonds.

DKE White convincingly captured the white handball championship against Chi Psi White, 3-0. O. Watson was pushed in the first two singles, splitting them 17-15, 10-15, before smashing to a 15-0 win in the final game.

B. Williams and A. Dawson took their doubles in two games, while R. Toomey and B. Hollan stretched out a 8-15, 15-0, 16-14 triumph over J. Holiday and D. Gowan of Chi Psi.

Tuesday the Peacocks downed Law IV Blue 2-0 in the graduate finale. Jimmy Hall and Danny McFall, and Bo Wood and Jimmy Addison each

won in two games.

Med School Blue's basketball fortune was shaken by City Planning Thursday but survived a 48-46 scare and put the quarterfinals.

Jim Smithwick poured in 19 for the winners, but Jeff Swain of the vanquished was high with 24.

MBA Blue trounced Law II Blue, 51-34, behind a balanced attack. Cranford (17), McKendrick (12) Robinson (11) and York (10) easily outdistanced Law, led by Bill Jones (15).

Wednesday Law IV Blue looked sloppy but still buried Village Blue, 54-31. Bill Brown (21) and Pud Hassell (11) paced the winner's entry into the quarterfinals. Ken Miller made 15 for the losers. Law IV is a tourney favorite.

New Faculty Appointed For 1968-69 Term

Chancellor J. Carlyle Sitterton announced Friday the addition of 14 new members of the Carolina faculty.

In the Business School there are four new faculty members. Sydney N. Afriat, now a professor at Purdue will become a professor of economics Sept. 1, 1968. A native of London, he has degrees from Cambridge and Oxford universities.

Harold Bartley Cook, assistant director of the University of Michigan Public Utility Executive Program from 1965 to 1968, will become an assistant professor on Sept. 1, 1968. His Ph.D. is pending at the University of Michigan.

Curtis P. McLaughlin, an assistant professor at Harvard from 1966 to 1968, will be an associate professor here Sept. 1, 1968. He has both the MBA and D.B.A. degrees from Harvard. Charles E. Richter who has taught at Kansas State and the University of Illinois and has the Ph.D. pending at Illinois will become an assistant professor on Sept. 1, 1968.

Arthur Cecil Stern will become a professor in the School of Public Health, beginning April 1, 1968. Since 1962 he has been assistant director of the U.S. Public Health Service's National Center for Air Pollution Control.

David Leo Lillie, a supervisor in the N.C. Mental Retardation Program for the State Department of Public Instruction, will hold two appointments; one as an associate professor in the School of Education, the other as head of the Special Education Section, the Biological Sciences Center of the Child Development Institute, beginning March 11, 1968.

Walter Herman Bell, Jr. will become an assistant professor in the Department of Linguistics, Slavic and Oriental Languages, starting Sept. 1, 1968.

Doris P. Bradley, an assistant professor since 1964 at the University of Oregon Medical School, will become an assistant professor in the School of Dentistry here March 15, 1968.

Stuart Burton Foundation, who received the D.D.S. at Chapel Hill and is now a research fellow at the University of Pennsylvania

will become an assistant professor in the Dentistry School, effective in August, 1968.

Julia Gorham Crane, now a visiting professor at Chapel Hill and formerly a researcher at the National Institutes of Health, will become an assistant professor of anthropology, beginning Sept. 1, 1968.

Waldemar Eger will become an assistant professor in the Department of Germanic Languages, beginning Sept. 1, 1968.

Walter Karl Francke will become an assistant professor on the Germanic Languages Department in September 1968.

Gerhard Foepfel, now at the Cologne Institute of Archaeology, will become an

assistant professor in the Department of Classics, beginning Sept. 1, 1968.
