Guidance Aid Offered

Benjamin and anyone else who's a little worred about his future should hear about the free "package deal' that the Guidance and Testing Center in Peabody Hall offers UNC students.

Vocational counseling, aptitude testing, occupational and educational information make up the service which is designed to help in the selection of a student's academic major and ultimate vocation. Connected with this service is a reading program aimed at the improvement of reading and study skills.

Both programs emphasize flexibility in structure and procedure which allow for easy adaptation to the particular needs of each student.

An informal discussion between a vocational counselor and the client concerning his academic background, work experience, interests, goals and any specific problems that he might have in such areas usually begins the decision-making process in the guidance program.

The initial battery of tests usually includes interest inventories, temperament and personality inventories and mental ability tests. Achievement, diagnostic, and specialized aptitude tests are sometimes selected for use on

interpreted by the counselor soon after completion. A discussion of the significance of test and inventory scores along with other pertinenent considerations follows.

A major intention of the counselor is to suggest several tentative academic or vocational objectives for further investigation.
