
Automated Weather

CODY. Wyo. (UPI)-The publicity, because Nixon as Shoshone National Forest's president would be just as bad, headquarters at Cody has one of the few operational telemeter weather stations in the United States. It incorporates automatic weather reporting systems and electric typewriters that automatically record weather information.

Recorded are temperatures, wind velocities and precipitation. Stations that feed information to the Cody point have rain guages that automatically dump water for every 100th of an inch of precipitation and make a record of each to arrive at total amounts.


