UNC's 'Diary' Airs Tuesday

CHAPEL HILL - A special television version of Gogol's "Diary of a Madman" will be presented on WUNC-TV (Channel 4) in the "North Carolina: The Arts" series.

The play, which was presented on stage here last spring, will be televised at 9 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15. A special repeat broadcast is scheduled at 3 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 20.

This will be the first television version of the complete work. The production was adapted by its star, British actor Michael Meneaugh, and UNC English Professor Richmond Crinkley, from the translation by Andrew MacAndrew. The television version was developed by Roger Koonce, executive producer and Bill Nannah, producer- director.

A study in comic isolation, "Diary of a Madman" tells the story of a Russian clerk (c. 1840) whose mind disintegrates because the people around him neglect him so completely.

The original music was written by British composer Robert Comford.


