

Harriers Defeat Clemson, 23-24

Carolina's cross country team won its third duel meet of the season Wednesday when the harriers edged Clemson, 23-24.

The Tar Heels placed 1-2 on the 5 1/4 mile run, but the Tigers still managed to take three of the top six positions.

Once again it was Kenny Helms who led Carolina distance runners. Helms, a junior from Charlotte, took an easy 12 second win over sophomore teammate Earl Owens.

Helms was timed in 28:29.5. Owens was closely followed by Clemson's Jason Hill, who missed second place by only three seconds.

The rest of the field was more loosely bunched, except for the race for fifth which the Tar Heels' Bruce Hafemeister, a freshman, won by two seconds over Clemson's Don Morgan.

Clemson nabbed fourth place with a 29:04 performance from Richard Furst.

Carolina took three of the bottom four positions. Co-captain Truett Goodwin finished seventh, Mark Gibson was eighth and Charlie Markman placed tenth.

Carolina's next meet is Monday afternoon here against Wake Forest.

Frosh Face Wake Without QB

The North Carolina Tar Babies will be without the services of quarterback Charlie Turco this afternoon when they travel to Wake Forest for a 3:00 p.m. encounter.

Turco suffered a knee injury in Carolina's 25-10 victory over Virginia on Friday and will be back in action next week.

Taking Turco's place in the starting lineup will be Paul Miller who has shared the quarterbacking duties with Turco throughout the first two Tar Baby games.

Miller, a left-handed thrower, has passed for 81 yards this season, completing five of eight passes. He has run for 81 more and is averaging 3.7 yards per carry.

Joining Miller in the starting backfield will be fullback Burt Culver and tailback Geof Hamlin. Culver has carried 25

times and has a 5-yard rushing average. Hamlin is averaging 3.6 yards per attempt on 38 carries.

The Deaclets are winless on the season, having lost to Clemson and Duke in the first two ballgames.

Regardless, Coach Ed Emory has a speedy squad that contains 28 scholarship performers.

The Baby Deacs, however, are very thin in the line. Only five players were recruited as guards or tackles, so Emory has his linemen firing fast and clean to make up for the lack in size.

"We have fine speed," said Emory. "This team rated higher on the West Point physical fitness test than ever before at Wake Forest. However, our problem is in the line. Many of our present linemen have to play both ways."

After an opening game loss to N.C. State, Coach Ron DeMelfi's Tar Babies gained an impressive victory over the Virginia freshmen at Kenan Stadium.

There's no reason to doubt the Tar Baby ground game will continue the form it showed against Virginia when it picked up 298 yards.

DeMelfi looks for another strong performance from Hamlin, who scored three touchdowns and gained 93-yards on the ground in the UVa win.

State-Virginia Top ACC Weekend

It's a nitty-gritty Saturday in the Atlantic Coast Conference this week.

A trio of league games, highlighted by the Virginia-N.C. State clash, will reshape the ACC standings and set up targets for the second half of the season.

Duke-Clemson and South Carolina-Maryland follow the UVa-State tilt in immediate importance and interest.

Two other ACC elevens, however, have other considerations besides inter-league skirmishing.

UNC and Wake Forest challenge a pair of the country's best teams, Florida and Purdue.

Virginia goes to Raleigh with an offense that leads the ACC in total offense, rushing and scoring. State coach Earle Edwards professes concern over the Cavaliers' excellent runner Frank Quayle, and counters with Bobby Hall, a good inside rusher.



Quayle is third in the nation in rushing, behind only Eugene "Mercury" Morris and O.J. Simpson, both of whom are rated certain first-round pro draft choices.

Edwards considers Hall the "best all-around player in our conference."

Virginia guard Chuck Hammer, an aggressive 202-pounder, graded 100 percent on his blocking last week. The "meanest man" on the Cavaliers has received the highest efficiency award for offensive linemen in his team's games.

The State defense, which has sputtered this season, obviously must play well for the Wolfpack to defeat Virginia.

The Clemson Tigers hope to initiate another drive to an ACC title after four winless weeks against outside opposition when they meet Duke.

Duke hasn't beaten the Rigers since 1963. The Blue Devils also face the unpleasant

task of having to meet an outstanding runner for the fifth consecutive week.

Clemson's Buddy Gore follows Warren Muir of South Carolina, Ron Johnson of Michigan, Billy Lovett of Maryland and Virginia's Quayle on the list of rushers who have plagued the Devils.

Maryland, jubilant after ending its 16-game losing streak last week against Carolina, takes on hot-and-cold South Carolina.

The Gamecocks suffered a 36-12 thrashing from State last Saturday.

Purdue lost its position atop the AP and UPI polls after its 13-0 setback to Ohio State Saturday. Wake Forest, traveling to Lafayette, Ind., will be the target of the revenge-minded Boilermakers this week.
