

Title Competition Nears End Saturday

Three of Saturday's four Atlantic Coast Conference games may affect the league championship.

Carolina and Virginia renew the oldest continuous rivalry between major college teams in the South in the only game without title overture.

Clemson, presently tied with N.C. State for the ACC lead, is at Maryland.

State hops over to Duke, which is not yet out of the title

picture. Wake Forest remains a factor and hosts South Carolina.

Rejuvenated by their win over State, Clemson and coach Frank Howard encounter Maryland. The powerful Tigers may be suspect of a false sense of security against the Terps, doormat of the ACC for the last few years.

Maryland employs an eight-man rush which puts heavy pressure on the running game and on the quarterback. The wall is led by tackles Mike

Grace and Tom Plevin.

Once a runner penetrates the Terps' defensive front, he finds a lot of daylight. Clemson backs Buddy Gore, all-time ACC rushing leader, and Ray Yauger are strong and spritely enough to get to the open spaces in the Terp secondary.

Maryland leads the conference in pass interceptions with 13. Its able guardians against the pass will find Clemson's Billy Ammons a quarterback-adversary worthy of their tightest security measures.

The 30-11-2 series edge Duke holds over State has been reduced in each of the last three years. The Wolfpack, which has faint ACC title hopes, figures to cut into Duke's advantage a little more this time around.

State will count on a superior effort on pass defense to bridle the Blue Devils' aerial attack that is romping to ACC records every week.

Quarterback Leo Hart and end Henley Carter are the Duke pass masters. Rushing help is provided by Phil Assack

and Don Baglien.

As one ACC writer put it, the winner of the Wake Forest-South Carolina game could be the scoreboard operator in Groves Stadium. He'll be busy trying to keep up with everything.

The meeting of Deacons and Gamecocks brings together two quarterbacks who go about their work with spectacular ideas. And with spectacular results.

Wake's Freddie Summers has piled up 652 yards total offense in his last two outings. USC's flashy sophomore Tommy Suggs threw a league record five touchdown passes last Saturday.

Both the Deacs and Gamecocks are averaging better than 23 points a game.

"This could be a spectator's dream," said Wake coach Bill Tate. Or a scoreboard operator's nightmare.

Georgia-Florida, LSU-Alabama Highlight Week's SEC Contests

ATLANTA (UPI)—If you think the Southeastern Conference grid race is tight now, wait until Saturday's action ends.

If the weekend follows form, the 10th ranked Georgia Bulldogs will have moved into the lead and present leader Auburn will be locked in a three-way tie for third.

Saturday's key games find Auburn facing 5th ranked Tennessee in the nightcap of a twin bill at Birmingham and Georgia paired against Florida in the Gator Bowl Stadium at Jacksonville.

Louisiana State plays

Alabama in the day half of the doubleheader that is drawing 140,000 to Legion Field in Birmingham and Mississippi, the other member of the SEC's first division, steps outside the conference to play independent Chattanooga—unbeaten and unranked No. 3 among the nation's small college teams.

If Georgia, Tennessee and LSU win, here's how the SEC race will look:
1-Georgia, 4-0-1
2-Tennessee, 2-0-1
3-Auburn, 3-1
4-Louisiana State, 3-1
Mississippi, 3-1

Auburn, 5-2 overall, has been a real surprise up to now but it's hard to see how the Tigers can keep it up. Even if they should beat Tennessee, 5-0-1, they've still got Georgia, 5-0-2, and Alabama, 5-2, ahead.

Tiger hopes rest on the passing of quarterback Loran Carter who, after a slow start, has passed for 1,100 yards and now, although fourth in this year's standings, is only 297 yards shy of the total offense mark of 1,372 with which he won the SEC title last year.

Tennessee, which opened by scoring eight points in the final

seconds to tie Georgia and has since won five straight, offers a balanced offense featuring quarterback Bubba Wyche, fullback Dick Pickens and tailback Richmond Flowers.

Florida's Larry Smith, the SEC's No. 1 rusher, is back and Georgia's Bruce Kemp, the No. 2 rusher, is out. But even so, the unbeaten Bulldogs appear too strong for the Gators who were picked to win the SEC crown but who haven't won a game in the past three weeks. And, after facing Houston's Paul Gipson last week, Georgia should have learned something about handling big runners.

Elsewhere in the Southeast this weekend, Kentucky, led by SEC scoring leader 11 touchdowns Dicky Lyons, hosts Vanderbilt; Mississippi State hosts Florida State in what is expected to be a wide-open passing duel; Georgia Tech hosts Navy; Memphis State hosts Houston; Miami will be at 4th-ranked Penn State; Southern Mississippi will be at San Diego State, the No. 1 small college team; Tampa, the No. 4 small college team, will be at East Carolina; and Tulane hosts Tulsa.
