# Daley Sees Illinois 'Mistakes' Federal Transition Begins

## Commission Endorses

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Representatives of President Johnson and his successor, Commission Endorses The following people have been endorsed by the Honor Systems Commission as candidates for seats on the men's and women's courts. MD (II) (Granville West) Rebel Good, Rife Hughey, Larry Krieger. MD (III) (West Chapel Hill) Jay Schwartz, Ben Hawfield. MD (V) (Old East, West) David Lanier. MD (VII) (Lower Quad) Robert Denton, David Wynne, Fred Rawlings. MD (XI) (Morrison) Andy Schorr. MD (XII) (James) Michael Starr.

All of the above districts have one seat each with the exception of MD (IV) which has two seats. WD (I) (Sorority and Town) Corrie Hutton, Martha Lovell, Lindley Moffett. WD (II) (Alderman, Kenan, McIver) Rebecca Pope, Kay Peacock. WD (III) (Spencer, Whitehead) none. WD (IV) (Nurses) Susan Jenkins. WD (V) (East and West) Jody Nelson. WD (VI) (Conner, Joyner, Parker) Crisley Reeves. WD (VII) (Granville East) Lindy Beazley, Mickie Helms, Patti Lewis, Linda Sessums, Mary Brent Smith. All of the above districts have one seat each with the exception of WD (I) and WD (VII) which have two seats each.

Richard M. Nixon, began post-election consultations Thursday on an orderly transfer of federal government control Jan. 20 to a Republican administration. While the President-elect rested with his family at Key Biscayne, Fla., Franklin Lincoln, 60, a member of Nixon's New York law firm, met with Charles S. Murphy, a special counsel to Johnson on transition problems. They were joined by William Blackburn, a Johnson aide, and William Harman, 27, a Nixon law associate. Presidential Press Secretary

George Christian said Nixon has an open invitation to see the President but "just when he will be here and what he desires, I just don't know." Lincoln said his first order of business would be talks with Budget Bureau officials and with John Macy, chairman of the Civil Service Commission, on filling an estimated 2,200 appointive federal positions, as well as swift clearance of Nixon's 11-member cabinet. One leading Republican mentioned in speculation about Nixon's cabinet choices, Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York, said he would

consider a major position in the government if Nixon offered it. "But I do not know what the final answer would be," Rockefeller said in Lisbon, Portugal. Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield and Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen proposed in interviews that Nixon appoint a "shadow cabinet" to work as high aides under existing department heads in the two months before the inauguration. In Illinois, which gave Nixon the boost he needed for victory 15 hours after balloting ended Tuesday night, Mayor Richard J. Daley of Chicago, the state's Democratic boss, refused to concede Illinois' 26 electoral votes to Nixon.

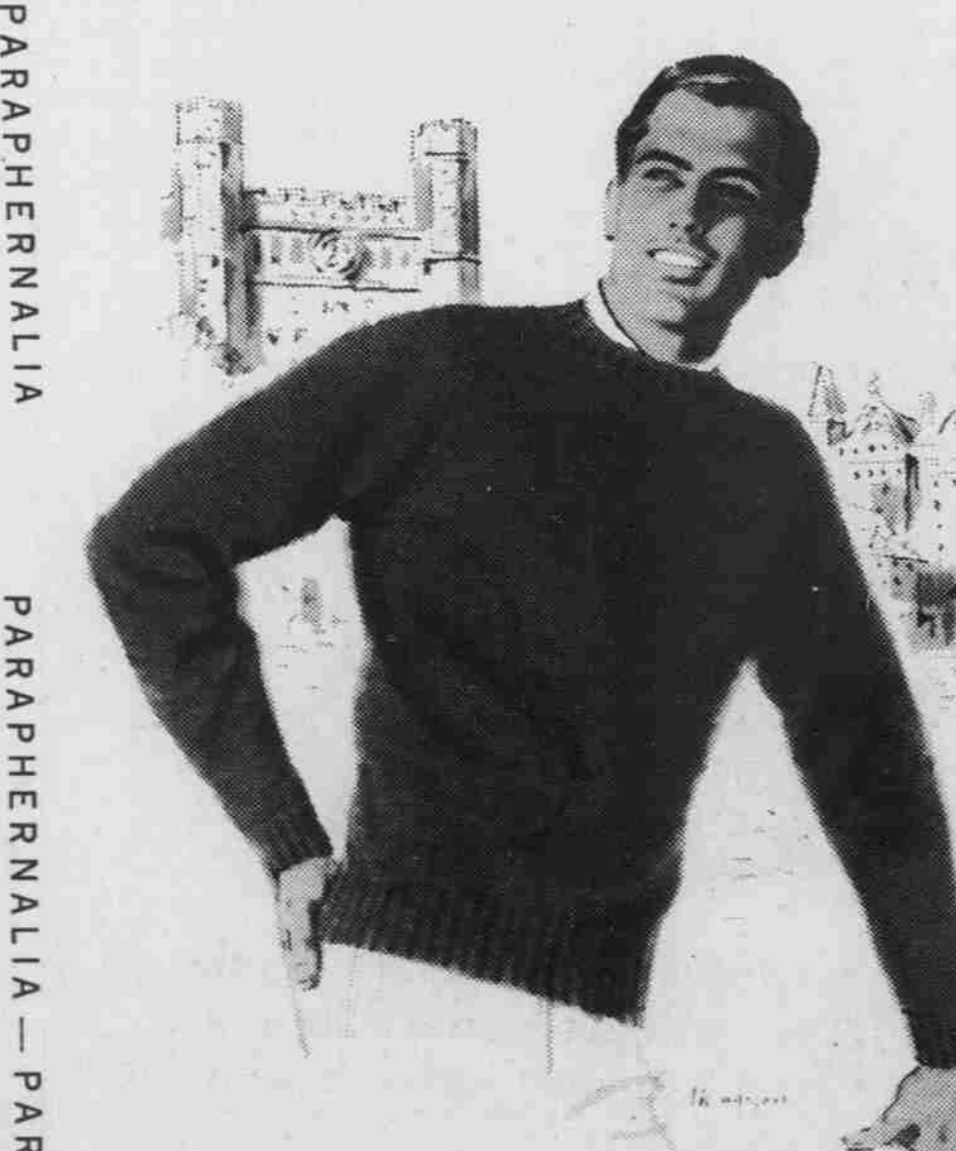
