'Umbrellas' Tops Free Flick Trio


The Carolina Union free flicks for "Dook Weekend" are top-rated entertainments in comedy, music and suspense.

Gregory Peck and Sophia Loren are the stars of ARABESQUE, the comedy thriller on tap for Friday night. It will be shown at 7, 9:30 and 11:30 p.m. in Carroll Hall.

Mancini did the score and Stanley Donen (CHARADE) did the directing in this fast-paced spy adventure. Gregory Peck is an American professor of hieroglyphics, who gets mixed-up in Middle Eastern intrigue. Sophia Loren proves to be the most intriguing ingredient of all!

On Saturday night, horror is the keynote when Bette Davis and Joan Crawford team up for the now-classic WHATEVER HAPPENED TO BABY JANE? Due to the length of this film, shows will begin at 6:30,






