Day Appoints Commission

A presidential commission to draft a statement on the campus judicial system will be appointed by student body president Ken Day.

The action is a result of an

open forum held Wednesday on problems facing the student judicial system. The meeting was attended by individuals of the Southern Students Organizing Committee (SSOC).

student legislature, the Faculty Committee on Student Discipline, and other interested faculty, undergraduate and graduate students.

"It's quite obvious that it's

necessary to draft a policy statement and then take each category and hold open hearings on the issues involved," said Alan Allbright, special assistant to Day on judicial affairs.

"This will give us a concrete document on which to base our decisions," he continued.

The commission will be representative of the group that attended Wednesday's meeting and will be headed by Allbright.

The basic concepts to be studied are both codes, student courts, penalties, jurisdiction, and the position of student courts in relation to civil courts.

Allbright hopes to have the initial statement from the commission sometime after Christmas. Hearings will be held during January with plans to submit the final statement to the first meeting of student legislature in February.

Branch Provides Figures For Student Stores Study

Ken Day, President of the Student Body, received Thursday "voluminous information" regarding a thorough break-down of the Student Stores operations over the past several years.

The financial reports and data were provided response to Day's letter to Director of University Services and Enterprises J.A. Branch dated November 27. The letter asked for a very thorough break-down of specific cost of operations, which "have been of great interest to many students."

Day said Thursday that a

study of the reports will be undertaken with full support of the Chancellor and business offices of the University.

The material will be turned over to student representatives on the Student Stores Committee, with the assistance of an appropriate business student and or the internal auditor of the University as the Committee may desire.

Day commented that he is "most pleased with the willingness shown by Mr. Branch to provide much-needed information, and

with his cooperation with student representatives in

answering further questions." He noted that the bulk of the material is significant and will require extensive work for interpretation and condensation.

Day asked that the committee work as quickly as possible to do a thorough and accurate job so that "all the student body can be presented with the full picture of Student Stores operations, to which they are entitled."

Biafra Driven Out

Biafrans, Cohen was largely responsible for writing the UN's Genocide Convention.

Cohen said, "When you create a condition which prohibits the ability to function of a nation or group, that condition is genocide. It is a violation of international code, for you are creating a generation of idiots."

Starvation, which has reached massive proportions in besieged Biafra, causes mental retardation in children because of the deficiency of protein.

Swedish Count G.G. von Rosen, a former World War II pilot who flew food supplies into Biafra, said that "it is not human to send in food without sending a means whereby the lives of the people can be effectively protected from bombing."

Von Rosen said that "the greatest service mankind can do for the cause of peace would be to seek a negotiated settlement between Nigeria and Biafra based on the principal of self-determination."

He said that the Biafrans will never give in despite the

fact that Nigeria is being provided with weapons by the British and the Russians while Biafra is receiving only minimal aid.

A minister who left his missionary post in Biafra just long enough to attend the conference said that his mission had only enough food to feed the children one meal every three days.

Loren Nistrom, a member of Canada's Parliament, spoke on "the conspiracy of silence between Canada, the U.S., and Britain." He said that these three powers should spearhead the movement to bring effective pressure to bear on Nigeria to stop the war.

He questioned America's neutrality, saying that a state department official recently visited African nations to tell that American aid would be cut off if they recognized Biafra's independence.

"We also want," Polin said, "to find out why the Peace Corps is still in Nigeria while Nigeria is waging a war of genocide against Biafrans."
