Oldest Mixed Chorus To Perform In Raleigh

On Dec. 2 and 3 in Reynolds Coliseum, the oldest mixed chorus in Sweden, The Stockholm University Chorus, will perform under the auspices of The Friends of the College.

Founded in 1931, it is composed mostly of students from Stockholm. The Chorus has participated in several tours to such countries as Germany, Austria, England, Finland, Italy and Poland. Their enormously successful first North American tour occurred during the Spring of 1967.

The Chorus has had the honor of performing during state visits to Sweden by various foreign dignitaries and heads of state such as Britain's Queen Elizabeth, Queen Juiliana of the Netherlands, the King and Queen of Thailand and the President of Finland. In addition, the group has appeared at Nobel Prize ceremonies, the most recent being Dec. 10, 1967, in the Stockholm Concert Hall.

Last September, the Chorus opened the Stockholm Music Festival with a work by the Danish composer Langgaard. Although Scandinavian composers are well represented

in their repertoire of approximately 600 numbers, the Chorus also performs the works of Brahms, Kodaly, Dubussy, Ravel, Britten, Monteverdi, Handel and Orff.
