

# Governors Invited To White House

SANTA FE, N.M.—President Nixon has called the 50 governors to the White House Monday to discuss "the disruption of peace, violence and potential violence throughout the nation," Gov. Raymond P. Shafer of Pennsylvania said Thursday.

Chairman of the Republican National Governors Conference, also cancelled the group's semiannual meeting scheduled to open here Thursday night. Shafer said he had conferred with White House officials who authorized him to announce that Nixon would meet with the nation's governors at 1:30 p.m. Monday.

Attendance at the GOP governors conference had

dwindled because many chief executives had stayed home to cope with disorders brought on by U.S. involvement in Cambodia and the killing of four Kent State University students by National Guardsmen. Shafer said Nixon wanted to discuss with the nation's governors the current wave of violence and campus turmoil and possible ways to stop it. Gov. David F. Cargo of New Mexico had ordered the National Guard to protect the Republican meeting against student disruptions. But, Shafer cancelled the conference when only 13 governors showed up. "The present crisis must receive the highest priority attention by all governors," Shafer said.

At a news conference, the Pennsylvania governor pleaded for all citizens to avoid violence to "make certain reason wins out over emotion."

At the time of Shafer's announcement, the only governors present were A. Lindwood Holton of Virginia, Deane C. Davis of Vermont, and Cargo.

Among those who stayed home because of campus violence in their states were Govs. William G. Milliken of Michigan, Francis Sargent of Massachusetts and Louie B. Nunn of Kentucky.

"It's a shame all this campus unrest had to happen right now," Cargo said. He said the White House meeting was expected to deal exclusively with campus unrest.

# Jones: Kent Students 'Entitled' To Be Shot

GREENVILLE, S.C.—The four students killed at Kent State University "got exactly what they were entitled to," the president of Bob Jones University told students at a Chapel Thursday.

"I'm all for the police shooting to kill when anyone is in mob violence attempting to destroy property and attack law enforcement officers," said Dr. Bob Jones. "More power to them."

"While I grieve for their families, I say those young people got exactly what they were entitled to, and what they should have expected and what they ought to get out in Berkeley, too," said Jones.

"I wish they would bring some mortars in and restore order at Berkeley," Jones said. "It's time the government took

a firm hand in dealing with this thing."

Jones, son of the late Dr. Bob Jones Sr., a widely-known evangelist and founder of the fundamentalist, non-denominational university, became president after his father's death in 1968.

The school, surrounded by a high fence, permits no student dissent and issued a statement several years ago taking pride in being called "the nation's squarest university." In 1969, Jones asked state permission to arm security guards with submachine guns but was turned down.

"It is contemptible for students to come in and attack a building and not expect to be killed," said Jones in his speech.

"It tickles me—these pink revolutionaries," he said.

"They want to stir up strife, they want to burn buildings, they want to throw rocks at police and shoot whom they please and throw firebombs."

"But you mustn't touch them."

Jones said, "If the reports that have come to me are accurate, and the pictures of that thing are true, those young people should have been shot."

"And the country's better off without that many more of that kind of young person," he said. "Let's get the sympathy where it belongs."

"These young people, many of them are plain old communist reds..."

He said of campus agitators, "If they get a few more of them killed they will start behaving themselves."

ATLANTA—Classes at all 27 state colleges and universities in Georgia were suspended for 83,000 students for the remainder of the week Thursday in the wake of demonstrations at the University of Georgia.

Two Georgia students filed suit, however, at Atlanta, site of the campus, attacking the action as unconstitutional and depriving them of equal protection under the law.

In other late developments, protesting students obtained a permit for a 7 p.m. march at Athens, and three students arrested in the Wednesday night demonstration were released on their own recognizance after first being placed under \$15,000 bond each.

Steve Barnes of Telfair County and William Moredock of York County, S.C., asked Supreme Court Judge James Barrow of Clarke County to enjoin President Fred Davison of Georgia and the University System of Georgia from closing the schools.

They contended that as paying students, they were being deprived of their property without due process of law and that only Gov. Lester Maddox had the right to close any unit of the university system. A hearing was set for Friday.
