

# Hitch-Hiker Avadon-Black Brings Theatre To UNC

In April of 1969, Avadon-Black left UCLA carrying only a pack and a sleeping bag. His goal was to hitch-hike around the United States—not simply to travel, but to spread his dream of "personalized theatre" to people.

During the past year, Avadon-Black has performed on college and university campuses across the nation. He arrived here last night in the Great Hall of the Union at 8 o'clock.

Avadon-Black's theatre is a combination of poignant stories about people he has met during his travels, the poetry of Stephen Crane and e.e. cummings, and a sequence of surrealistic characters which involve the audience.

Avadon-Black's dream is to bring the beauty and power of his theatre into the lives of people everywhere. Each performance becomes an experience created for that audience. The audience is more than just spectators.

"It is necessary for people to get together outside of their roles to truly understand each other," he said. "My way, the way I feel I can be more effective, is through the theatre and conveying people to other people."

Since the beginning of his hitch-hiking ventures, Avadon-Black has traveled throughout the southwest, the Mississippi area, Florida and now he is headed up the East Coast.

When Avadon first goes to a college campus, he sets up a booth and does magic tricks to get to know the students. "Magic is like a common denominator in reaching people," he said. "It's a way of talking to people and seeing how they react."

There is no charge for the show. Donation, however, will be accepted to "keep Avadon-Black traveling." "A donation may be many things," he said, "a meal, a room, an appreciation of the theatre."

Part of Avadon-Black's "dream" for the theatre of the future is free admission and participation. Avadon-Black plans to continue traveling indefinitely. Eventually he would like to organize a touring group for his "personalized theatre" dream.

Students are invited to see Avadon-Black perform and to talk with him after the performances or at his booth in the Union during the day.

## Miss President 'Speaks' At Capitol

### Students Don't Listen, Even To A Pretty Face

Who is she? What's a girl like her doing heading up a protest march? Those were the questions of visiting press in Raleigh Friday. And the girl they were asking questions about was Cathy Sterling, the first woman president of N.C. State's student body.

There she stood in front of thousands of screaming students. "All right," she said. "I'm going to read Gov. Scott's statement." She was mad—and she felt she had lots of reason to be. These students were being rude—and she had just gotten out of a meeting which must have been frustrating at best.

Earlier that day she and Tommy Bello, UNC's student body president, had spoken to the crowd at the State student union. They had both promised the crowd that big things could be in the offing. And the crowd had cheered. Both presidents had had their constituencies completely with them.

Gov. Scott has done more than any other governor... And the reporters read into that a very large "but" and responded to her that way. "But" what? We'll probably never know, Cathy Sterling wasn't saying immediately after the rally... and probably even she wouldn't be sure now.
