

# Cansler, SG Leaders Discuss Open House

Associate Dean of Student Affairs James O. Cansler met with Student Government representatives Wednesday in a meeting that apparently brought both sides closer to agreement on the disputed Visitations Policy.

Student Body President Tom Bello, Vice President Bill Blue and Attorney General John McDowell sat with Cansler "a good portion of the afternoon" in an attempt to reach agreement on guidelines for the policy.

Both sides were close-mouthed concerning the transactions of the meeting.

Blue said both sides agreed "pretty much" but still maintain disagreement

over some issues. According to Blue, the results of the meeting will be presented to Student Legislature today if an SL meeting does occur.

McDowell indicated much of the conversation centered around penalties for violators of the Visitations Policy.

The debate hinged on whether or not student courts should sanction penalties or provide individual penalties for violators, according to McDowell.

Cansler's only remarks about the meeting were to say, "It was an extension of the discussion between the Student Government and myself over the Visitations Policy." Cansler said the results should be known by the end of the week.

## Court Order Freezes Funds; Case Will Be Heard Today

has been subpoenaed by the court.

Those listed as having resigned are Peter Schmuck (MD-III), Judith Helene Friedman (WD-IV), Thomas Pace (MD-VII), Charles Tucker Anderson (MD-III), Robert Livingstone Niles (MD-XI), William Robert Bartel (MD-VII), Virginia Branch Barte (WD-VII), Grady Woodfin Ballenger (MD-II), Mary Grazier Dickson (WD-II), and William Brewster Conn (MD-IX).

Named as having been appointed at the session is David Rooks of Men's District Three.

The complaint challenges the validity of the resignations and the appointment of Rooks and says the legislature should be declared invalid, if it is found that a quorum was not present.

The complaint also charges that Rooks is not a resident of the district which he was appointed to represent Waddell

said Wednesday that although funds were frozen by the injunction he is "unsure that the Supreme Court has the power to freeze funds."

The session of the court this afternoon, Benton said, was called to rule on the case as quickly as possible.

"The court is meeting as soon as possible," Benton said, "to avoid a confrontation between the two branches of Student Government, the legislative and the judicial."

There were rumors early Wednesday that the Student Legislature would meet tonight whether the court moved to grant injunction relief or not.

Benton's injunction forbade any session of the legislature under penalty of contempt of court.

If the court does declare the special session null and void, the legislature would be free to re-enact the legislation passed during the summer.

That legislation included \$16,000 in budget cuts from the 1970-71 budget and a \$20,000 appropriation establishing Carolina Graphics, a student-owned print

shop which would print the Daily Tar Heel and do job printing for students.

Profits from the shop would go to the students in the form of additions to the Student Government budget.

At present, the print shop is enjoined from doing any printing other than that done for The Daily Tar Heel.
