

Widgeon Paces Heels Again Duke Defeats Harriers

The Carolina cross-country team lost to Duke Saturday, 21-40, in a dual meet run at Finley Golf Course.

Blue Devil stars Bob Wheeler and Mike Graves won the race as they crossed the finish line arm in arm, eight seconds ahead of Tar Heel captain Larry Widgeon, who finished with a time of 25:08. UNC's Tony Waldrop took fourth place, running a 25:32 race.

Duke wrapped up its victory by grabbing the fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth spots. Blue Devils Larry Forrester (26:02), Phil Wilson (26:03) and Roger Beardmore (26:04) scored, while Phil Sparling (26:16) and Steve Wheeler (26:23) served as displacers.

Tar Heel runners occupied the next six slots. Mike Caldwell, with a 26:29 time, finished tenth, Roy Helm was eleventh at 26:38, Bruce Hafemeister twelfth at 26:45, Pat Grady thirteenth at 27:04,

Steve Grathwohl fourteenth at 27:08, and Bill Harward fifteenth at 27:19.

Duke runners took the sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth, nineteenth and twenty-second positions, while Tar Heel harriers Al Powell, Jim Sellers, and Clay Lynch finished twentieth, twenty-first, and twenty-third, respectively.

Duke's record is now 6-1, with their only loss coming at the hands of ACC front-runner Maryland. The Tar Heel slate now stands at 4-4.

"We just had a bad day," said Widgeon. "What beat us was their grouping up, besides the fact that they just outran us."

"I still think we can possibly beat them at the conference meet," he explained. "With so many runners they won't be able to bunch up."

"I was mad at myself at the finish because I had a lot left, but que sera sera," he laughed. "Mike Caldwell did a real good job, breaking his personal record by thirty seconds."

The Tar Heels' next opponent is East Carolina, whom they face in Greenville October 27. That meet will mark the end of Carolina's regular season. The ACC championships are slated for November 9.

Booters Meeting Jax After Win

The Carolina soccer team will host Jacksonville University Monday afternoon on Fetzer Field at 3:00. The varsity game follows a 1:00 match between the Tar Heel freshmen and New Hanover High School.

Jacksonville went undefeated last year, and will probably bring another fine team north. Coach Marvin Allen's Tar Heel team is playing its best soccer in a month, as Louis Bush has completely recovered from his injury.

Bush scored three goals on Friday to lead Carolina to an 8-0 stomping of East Carolina.

The former All-American from Brazil began the Tar Heel scoring in the first period on an unassisted goal.

Early in the second quarter, John McCallie slammed home a Tim Morse pass to make the score 2-0. After Morse tallied on a corner kick from Dave Feffer,

Bush scored on a direct penalty kick. Bush's final goal of the day came later in the quarter to give Carolina a 5-0 halftime lead.

East Carolina managed to check the Carolina scoring in the third period, but the Tar Heels exploded in the final quarter for three more goals.

Van Allen scored first on an assist from Morse, and later he knocked a pass from Bill Kohler past the outclassed ECU goalie to widen UNC's lead to seven goals. With an assist from Kohler, Al Merrill finished off the day's scoring.

Carolina outshot its opponents, 41-6.

Hart, Jones Pace Duke Win

CLEMSON, S. C. UPI—Leo Hart tossed a 20-yard scoring pass to fullback Steve Jones late in the third quarter to put Duke in the lead for the first time, then clinched a 21-10 victory over Clemson Saturday with a six-yard touchdown run to keep the Blue Devils atop the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Trailing 10-7, Duke gained possession midway in the third quarter when Clemson's Ray Yauger fumbled on the Duke 34. The Blue Devils marched to the Tigers' 36 from where Jones ripped off 16 to the 20. Hart then tossed to Jones

from there for the lead. Hart later ran six yards for the final score on an option.

Bullish running by Jones, who carried 38 times for 174 yards, helped set up all three Duke scores.

Clemson jumped in front 7-0 early in the second quarter when Don Kelley intercepted a pass from Hart and raced 100 yards for a touchdown, setting a school record.

But Duke bounced right back, Brad Evans throwing six-yards to tight end Dan Phelan. Eddie Seigler kicked a 30-yard field goal for a 10-7 Clemson lead at halftime.

The final Duke touchdown came late

in the game following a Clemson punt. Starting at their own 42, the Blue Devils marched downfield, primarily on the running of Jones and the passing of Hart to his favorite target, Wes Chesson. Hart scrambled over from the six for the score.

Chesson, the leading pass-catcher in the ACC, pulled in 13 aerials for 149 yards.

Clemson nearly scored in the first quarter when B. B. Elvington recovered a fumble on the Clemson 43 and the Tigers drove to the Duke four, only to have a sticky defense rise up to put down the scoring threat.
