Clymer led Kentucky's runners with 97 vards. The Wildcats rushed for 213,and shut out the Wolfpack in the second

Edward's only hope this weekend is that Virginia's mistakes continue.

There has rarely been a more exciting game than the Georgia win over South Carolina. The Bulldogs' comeback brought memories of the Georgia-Carolina game in '65, when four TDs in the last quarter gave the Dogs a

Dick Harris' 93-yard interception return and 96-yard kickoff return. combined with Tommy Suggs' 80-yard bomb to Jim Mitchell, provided the Gamecocks with a 28-18 halftime lead.

But Paul Gilbert, the third quarterback Vice Dooley has used this year, ran for three touchdowns, and hit Billy Brice with a 60-yard scoring pass to bring the Bulldogs back.


