

SEC Teams Devastate ACC Quartet

Just as major league baseball teams schedule exhibitions with minor league affiliates in the middle of the season, Southeastern Conference football teams sometimes lower themselves to play ACC schools.

The results are big gates, big point spreads, and big wins for the SEC.

The pattern held up this weekend when Tennessee beat Wake 41-7, State lost to Kentucky 27-2 and Georgia came back to outscore South Carolina 52-34.

Georgia Tech, a former SEC team, added insult to injury with a 24-16 win over Duke. In the only conference game, Clemson broke its five-game losing streak with a 24-14 win over Maryland, while Carolina beat Virginia 30-15.

Duke and Georgia Tech traded touchdowns in the first half, with the Blue Devils holding a 16-10 intermission lead.

But Brent Cunningham, who rolled 105 yards on 23 carries, scored on a pass from Eddie McAsham and Phil Beavers took an interception 75 yards for another touchdown to clinch Tech's sixth victory.

Leo Hart completed 17 of 30 for 242 yards, but his two interceptions came at crucial times.

Duke halfback Bill Thompson gained only 74 yards, with 73 of them coming on a touchdown run in the second quarter.

The Blue Devils now prepare for their showdown with Wake Forest this Saturday, if the Deacons can regroup from their disaster in Memphis.

Although Wake rushed for 202 yards and Junior Moore broke loose for a 61-yard touchdown, the Volunteers took a 27-7 halftime lead on the passing of Bobby Scott.

He struck for 180 yards on 14 completions. Halfback Steve Wold took Scott's only touchdown pass, and ran for a four-yard score in the first quarter.

The Deacons had a chance to score in the third quarter, getting a first down on

the four yard line, but Tennessee's defense tackled Larry Russell on the 22 and blocked a field-goal try.

All the scoring in the State-Kentucky game took place in the first half, as Earle Edwards continued to search for his missing offense.

The Wolfpack got only 87 yards all day. Its only score was a safety. Bill Miller blocking a punt out of the end zone in the second quarter.

Quarterback Bernie Seriggs led the Wildcat attack with three touchdown passes, one to Wake Forest transfer Lee Clymer.

Clymer led Kentucky's runners with 97 yards. The Wildcats rushed for 213, and shut out the Wolfpack in the second half.

Edward's only hope this weekend is that Virginia's mistakes continue.

There has rarely been a more exciting game than the Georgia win over South Carolina. The Bulldogs' comeback brought memories of the Georgia-Carolina game in '65, when four TDs in the last quarter gave the Dogs a 47-35 win.

Dick Harris' 93-yard interception return and 96-yard kickoff return, combined with Tommy Suges' 80-yard bomb to Jim Mitchell, provided the Gamecocks with a 28-18 halftime lead.

But Paul Gilbert, the third quarterback VCS Dooley has used this year, ran for three touchdowns, and hit Billy Brice with a 60-yard scoring pass to bring the Bulldogs back.

After Billy DuPre's field goal gave SC a 34-32 lead in the fourth quarter, Gilbert scored twice. Kim Braswell booted his second field goal and the Georgia defense trapped Jackie Young in the end zone.

Clemson's Don Kelley is rivalling Harris for explosiveness. His 85-yard punt return gave the Tigers a 10-3 lead over Maryland, in the last period, and his 56-yard interception set up the clinching touchdown.

Jewell McLaurin also picked off a pass and returned it 68 yards for a score.

The Terps held Tommy Kendrick to 71 yards in the air while their own passer, Jeff Shogars, hit 11 for 27 for 139 yards. Despite their 372-212 lead in total offense, Maryland suffered six turnovers.

Carolina will stage its annual Blue-White basketball game in Carmichael Auditorium Saturday following the Tar Heel football game against Virginia Military Institute.

Gametime is set for 4:30 p.m. and, as usual, a banner crowd is expected.

Coach Dean Smith will be unveiling a Tar Heel team that is regarded as a question mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season. Gone is Charlie Scott, the all-America performer, and two fine guards, Eddie Fogler and Jim Delany.

Smith feels, however, the Tar Heels have a chance to have a good season. Some of the leading returnees are center Lee Dedmon, forwards Dennis Wuyck, Bill Chamberlain and Dave Chadwick and guards Steve Previs, Dale Gipple and Kim Huband.

There are only two scholarship players up from last year's freshman team. They are guard George Karl and forward-center Donn Johnston.

Current freshman scholarship players will take part in the Blue-White contest, too. They are Bobby Jones of Charlotte, N.C., Darrell Elston of Tipton, Ind., Ray Hite of Washington, D.C., and John O'Donnell of New York City.

All seats for the game will be reserved. Student tickets are free provided the students pick them up at Carmichael Auditorium Tuesday or Wednesday. After Wednesday, student tickets will sell for \$1.

Staff members will be admitted for \$1. Tickets for the general public are priced at \$2. These tickets can be purchased at the Carmichael ticket office any time this week.


