

# On Russel's Pass Deacons Down State

Winston-Salem (UPI) Junior quarterback Larry Russell hit halfback Ken Garrett with a 10-yard pass late in the fourth period Saturday to give Wake Forest a 16-13 Atlantic Coast Conference victory over North Carolina State.

Wake Forest had jumped ahead 10-6 in the third period as a result of a key play by the Deacons. Ed Stetz, the junior from Johnstown, Pa., broke through the Wolfpack line, blocked a punt in State's end zone and fell on it for a touchdown.

But State regained the lead in the final period following linebacker Stauber Wilson's recovery of a Deacon fumble at the Wake Forest 20. Wingback Pat Kenney caught a bullet pass from Dennis Britt for a Wolfpack touchdown on the next play.

# Unranked Georgia Stuns Auburn, 31-17

AUBURN, Ala. (UPI)—An aroused, 20-point underdog University of Georgia used the slandering running of sophomore Ricky Lake and some tremendous interior blocking Saturday to upset the 7th-ranked Auburn Tigers 31-17.

Lake, running for nearly 100 yards, scored on plunges of one and four yards, the second one coming early in the final period and giving Georgia its go-ahead touchdown.

The Bulldogs put the regionally televised upset on ice seven minutes later when Jack Montgomery leaped across from a yard out.

# Virginia Rips Colgate 54-12

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. (UPI)—Sophomore Bill Troup threw four touchdown passes in the second period Saturday to propel Virginia to a 54-12 victory over Colgate.

The Cavaliers spotted Colgate a pair of first-period touchdowns on passes by Steve Goepel before erupting for five touchdowns of their own in the second quarter.

Troup, from Bethel Park, Pa., hit end Bob Bischoff with a 32-yard pass to climax a 78-yard drive and start the Cavalier scoring spree.

Virginia then scored the next four times it had the ball. Gary Helman bulled over from the 1, and Troup threw touchdown passes of nine yards to flanker Chuck Moser, three yards to Helman, and 55 yards to tight end Bill Davis.

# Notre Dame Nips Fired Up Jackets

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (UPI)—Denny Allan plunged two yards for a touchdown with 6:28 to play Saturday to carry Notre Dame from behind to a 10-7 win over rugged Georgia Tech.

Theismann had almost as difficult an afternoon. Although Theismann completed 15 of 30 passes for 272 yards, the Tech defense got to him three times when he was attempting to pass, throwing him for 26 yards in losses. And for the entire game, Theismann gained only 21 yards on the ground in 18 carries.

They went into the game sharing the No. 1 spot with Texas against a Tech team which had been beaten twice. But the Engineers displayed the toughest defense Notre Dame has seen all season and outgated the Irish almost all the way. For ten and one half minutes before Allan's scoring plunge, Tech was in front by 7-3 score on the strength of a 66-yard touchdown play in which sophomore quarterback Eddie McAshan hit flanker Larry Studdard behind the Notre Dame pass defense and Studdard outran the Irish into the end zone.

It was only the third pass completed by McAshan in 10 tries, though, and he wound up with only seven completions in 19 attempts for 109 yards.
