

Tar Heel Fencers Are Strong Again

UNC's most successful varsity sport, fencing, held its third annual Blue-White meet Wednesday night in Carmichael Auditorium.

The fencers, who have a 29-2 record over the past three seasons, have lost only three lettermen from last year's team which went 9-1 and finished second to N.C. State in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Junior Charlie Potcat, who had a 25-4 record last year, leads the returnees in the foil, while Dick Betts, two-time All-ACC in sabre, has been switched to foil this season.

"Others with strong potential," says Head Coach Ron Miller, "include Brad

Vasick, a junior, and non-letterman sophomores Robert Cromatic and Bob Varley."

"In epic we have the most depth," explained Miller. "We've got four seniors, all of whom have been either all-conference or have gone to the NCAA's. They're all about equal."

Bo McBee, a senior, figures to be Carolina's stopper in sabre. After winning All-ACC honors in foil as a sophomore, he was switched to sabre where he compiled a 19-7 record, "good enough to send him to the national championships," according to Miller. Other starters include juniors Bub Griscom and Dave Brown.

"My outlook as usual is optimistic," says Miller. "We'll be going with more or less the same group as last year. We'll carry a varsity squad of 24, and a novice team of ten to twelve beginners."

"One of our biggest meets will be January 24 against Cornell, which perennially ranks among the top two or three in the country," explained Miller.

The Tar Heels opening meet of the season is away against Vanderbilt and the University of Tennessee December 5.

Is Chesson Overlooked?

While such players as Don McCauley, Leo Hart and Tommy Suggs have been attracting most of the attention among the Atlantic Coast Conference's statistical leaders this season, one performer has been overlooked. He is Duke's versatile Wes Chesson, whose specialty is catching a football.

Chesson, a highly-sought after quarterback at Edenton, N.C., High School, has played several positions during his Duke career, but the job he has done best is being on the receiving end of teammate Hart's passes. With one game remaining, he already has tucked away just about all of the ACC single-season and career records.

In a wild offensive game against South Carolina last week, Chesson caught 10 passes for 189 yards to up his season total of 69 catches and 930 yards.

This erases the previous record of 65 catches and 892 yards set by his former teammate of two years ago, Henley Carter. Chesson had already broken the career mark held by former South Carolina star Fred Zeigler.

The only record Chesson doesn't hold is for touchdown passes. His total of nine is three short of the career record of 12 held by former Maryland star Gary Collins.

The Duke star is one of three receivers who have surpassed the 500-yard mark

for the year. Only one player in the ACC reached this level a year ago. South Carolina's Jimmy Mitchell jumped from fifth place to second by catching five for 81 yards last week. He now has 34 for the year and 710 yards.

Virginia's Dave Sullivan is third with 514 yards.

McCauley is still the league's top rusher with an average of 144.1 yards per game. The Tar Heel star, who had set a single-season rushing mark the week before, established the career figure on his first carry against Clemson.

He now has 2,878 yards, which better the old mark of 2,695 set by Frank Quayle of Virginia.

Hart has wrapped up the total offense and passing titles for the year and is the first ACC player in history to lead both departments three years in a row.

McCauley, who has 16 touchdowns for the year and 96 points, still has a chance to set records in both departments.

Dick Harris of South Carolina has already set both ACC and NCAA records for kickoff return yardage.

While this was going on, Phi Delt Blue was disposing of Aycock, the Residence Hall champions, with very little difficulty, 38-0.
