in cooperation with the National Brewery.


All proceeds will go to the Campus Chest.

pointed out, were "by and large lame can reconsider sections and resolve some duck." Newly elected legislators did not vote on the budget under present consideration.

Stallings' second objection was that "legislature appropriated at least \$3,000 more than its projected revenue."

This objection was also raised by Robert Grady, chairman of the Finance Committee. "Deficit spending is illegal," he said. "We expect the general surplus will be overdrawn, causing us to stop honoring budget requests. Where are we going to get the additional money?" asked Grady.
