## College Foundation scholars meet today

Norman Watson, director of College Foundation, Inc. and the Bryan Fund, will meet with students who are under loans from the foundation today at 3 and 7 p.m. in 104 Howell Hall.

William Geer, director of the Student Aid Office, said it is important for loan recipients to attend.

"It is important for students who have borrowed from the College Foundation to attend this meeting to learn the latest information about the operation of the loans. The interest rates, the availability of funds and repayment plans will be discussed," Geer said.

"Students who have never borrowed from College Foundation," Geer added, "may also be interested in attending to learn the availability of these loans to them."

Geer said about 400 students now have loans from the foundation varying

from \$500-\$1,500 at a rate of 7 per cent plus a half per cent fee.

## Stallings angered by budget results

pointed out, were "by and large lame duck." Newly elected legislators did not vote on the budget under present consideration.

Stallings' second objection was that "legislation appropriated at least \$3,000 more than its projected revenue."

This objection was also raised by Robert Grady, chairman of the Finance Committee. "Deficit spending is illegal," he said. "We expect the general surplus will be overdrawn, causing us to stop honoring budget requests. Where are we going to get the additional money?" asked Grady.

Stallings has considered signing the

budget "because then the new legislature can reconsider sections and resolve some of its problems." If he vetoes the budget, the old legislature would consider further action. "I have a lot of faith in the new legislature," Stallings commented.

He added that he liked some programs included in the budget, such as the Black Student Movement, and would not like these changed if a reconsideration of the budget were necessary.

"I am not bitter," Stallings remarked. "I expressed willingness to cooperate. I still see the need for give and take between the president and legislature, but I am concerned that it not become a one-way street."
