

Trial slated today in Tom Bello killing

Tom Gooding, charged with the first degree murder of Tom Bello, has waived preliminary hearings and will be tried today at 3 p.m. in the UNC Law School courtroom.

Gooding's murder trial, a staged event, is part of the Phi Alpha Delta annual mock trial. Any interested student may sign-up as a juror in front of the Undergraduate Library beginning at 10:30 a.m.

Bello, former UNC student body president, was shot and killed last Monday while walking through campus.

Gooding, former editor of The

Daily Tar Heel, was apprehended shortly after the shooting took place.

The State reportedly will be requesting capital punishment for Gooding, who waived preliminary hearings before District Court Judge Dan Dobbs.

It was revealed that Judge Ken Broun will hear the case with Jon Anderson acting as prosecuting attorney and Steve Edelstein defending the former editor.

All interested students are invited to attend the trial.

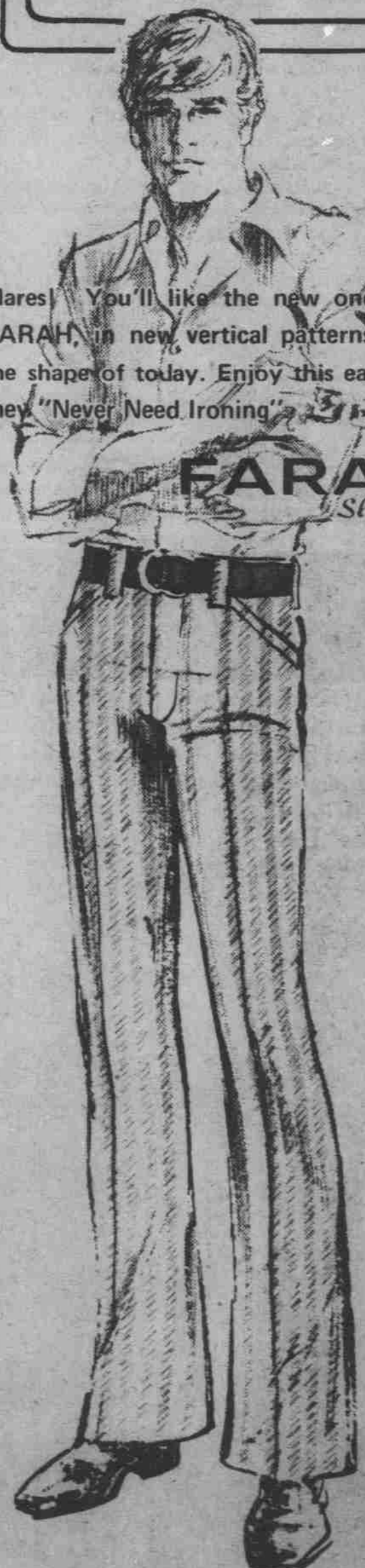
