# **Democrats** must fight for changes - Lindsay

PHOENIX, Ariz. - New York Mayor effective anti-pollution laws. John V. Lindsay said Sunday the Democrats must be "willing to fight for changes" if they hope to recapture national leadership next year.

Lindsay, a Republican turned Democrat and considered a dark horse possiblity for the 1972 Democratic presidential nomination, told the Democratic State Convention that the party's goals should include :

- Some kind of work program for Vietnam veterans, slum dwellers and other unemployed.

- Laws to plug tax loopholes.

- A pledge that there will be no more Vietnams.

Phoenix was Lindsay's first stop in a barnstorming tour of the West during which he is expected to continue the exploration of his presidential prospects he began in New Hampshire last weekend.

### Nixon meets Hirohito; security measures tight

TOKYO - Japanese authorities ordered stringent security measures Sunday to protect Emperor Hirohito against threats of violence by leftwing students and others opposed to his trip to Alaska and Europe.

Hirohito is scheduled to meet President Nixon during a stopover in Anchorage, Alaska, the first official stop on the first foreign tour of any monarch of Japan.

The 70-year-old emperor and empress Nagako, 68, are to leave Tokyo International Airport aboard a chartered Japan Airlines jet plane around 9:30 a.m. Monday, local time, 8:20 p.m. EDT Sunday with a retinue of 34 persons. including Foreign Minister Takeo Fukuda.

The government deployed 3,500 policemen at the airport and its highway approaches to guard the royal pair.

# Gold importance cut by Secretary Connally

WASHINGTON - Treasury Secretary John B. Connaly said Sunday the United States will try to diminish the importance of gold in the world monetary system.

Speaking at a news conference on the eve of the annual meeting of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Connaly called gold a "political problem. not an economic problem," and said the United States did not want "to encourage any action ... that would enhance the position of gold."

Currently, gold is the measure of value for the dollar, which in turn, is the standard upon which other world currencies are based.

Connaly, who heads the U.S. delegation to the IMF convention, also said the United States was not looking for a trade war, but that the controversial 10 percent import surcharge would remain in: effect until the major trading nations could agree on a formula to ease the U.S. balance of payments problem.

#### **Brezhnev** visits Hungary

SOFIA, Bulgaria - The Soviet Union's Todor Wzhivkov and other party and Leonid I. Brezhnev arrived Sunday from Hungary on the second stage of his flying tour through Eastern Europe to brief Warsaw Pact leaders on his talks with Yugoslav President Tito.

Brezhnev, the general secretary of the Soviet Communist Party, was met at Sofia Airport by Bulgarian party chief government leaders.

His arrival came before the Hungarian news agency MTI had announced his departure from Budapest. This underlined Hungary's ovbious tendency to keep news about the Brezhnev visit in Budapest to a minimum.

## **Dock strike negotiations**

SAN FRANCISCO, California -Negotiators in the 88-day-old West Coast dock strike, urged personally by President Nixon to get "off dead center," resume talks today with the goal of settling the dispute this week.

Nixon held a 20-minute long meeting with longshore labor leader Harry Bridges and shippers' negotiator Ed Flynn in a Portland, Oregon, hotel suite Saturday.

It was the President's first personal intervention in a labor dispute since he took office, although negotiations have

been conducted by his top labor mediator for the past two weeks.

The strike by 15,000 members of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union began July 1 at 24 West Coast ports. It has tied up nearly 200 ships and severely hampered international trade in the Pacific.

Nixon said after his meeting with the negotiators that Bridges and Flynn were "still far apart on some issues" but had promised to "set as a goal to reach a settlement by the end of the next week.
