Duke freshmen host unbeaten Tar Babies

The Carolina freshman squad will put their perfect 4-0 record on the line Saturday night when they travel to Durham to battle the Duke freshmen in the annual Cerebral Palsy game.

The Tar Babies have won the last ten contests between the two but this season Duke feels they have the horses to break the string.

Rivalry, as always, will play a big part in the game with the series dating back to 1953, when Sonny Jurgensen was quarterbacking the Duke freshmen.

The games have been notoriously close with 12 of the 18 games being decided by a touchdown or less.

The Tar Babies will be led by the outstanding signal-calling duo of Chris Kupec and Charles Baggett.

Kupec has impressed everyone this season with his passing. The Syosset, N.Y. native has completed 36 of 53 passes for 672 yards and eight touchdowns.

While Baggett has passed only half as much as Kupec, the Fayetteville, N.C. native has made his mark as a ball carrier.

The only back to have rushed for more yardage than Baggett is tailback Jimmy DeRatt.

The leading receiver for the Tar Babies all season has been walk-on Ray Stanford.

blitzing of New Hanover High School. Nelson's troops kicked off the season in similar style, taking Brevard Jr. College by a 4-0 count.

Sandwiched in between were wins over Chapel Hill High (4-1), Warren Wilson College (1-0), Independence High (3-1) and a disappointing 2-2 tie with Duke.

"A coach couldn't have been luckier than I was in terms of the amount of talent on hand," says Nelson of his 7-0-1 team. "We were blessed with

some fine players and I wasn't at all surprised that we went undefeated."

The available talent didn't go undeveloped. Nelson, the current president of the National Soccer Coaches Association, is one of the most knowledgeable soccer men in the nation.

He built in an aggressive, fast-moving style of play that prepared an unusually high number of players for next year's varsity.

"We expect to have from eight to ten boys from the freshman team make the varsity next season," he predicts. "We simply had an excellent crop of soccer players."

Freshmen Nick Jones, Mark Maropoulos, David Taylor, Steve Dawson and Rick Culberson spent most or all of the 1971 season on the varsity, but plenty of high-quality freshmen were left on Nelson's squad.

Forward Culberson, who scored the only UNC goal in the varsity's 3-1 loss to Maryland Monday, was the key to the Tar Baby offense for most of the season.

"Culberson was the best player we had," says Nelson. "He's highly skilled, he still doesn't realize his full capabilities yet. We expect a lot from him next year."

Duke tix on sale today

A limited number of tickets to the Duke-Carolina football game in Durham Nov. 20 will be available to students this morning at 8:30 in the Carmichael Auditorium ticket office.

Students can buy tickets for \$6. IDs are required. The high cost is necessary because Duke's officials went to a great amount of expense to build bleachers to seat the large crowd expected.

Season basketball tickets for students' wives will be available next Monday through Wednesday at the ticket office, open from 8:30-4:30.

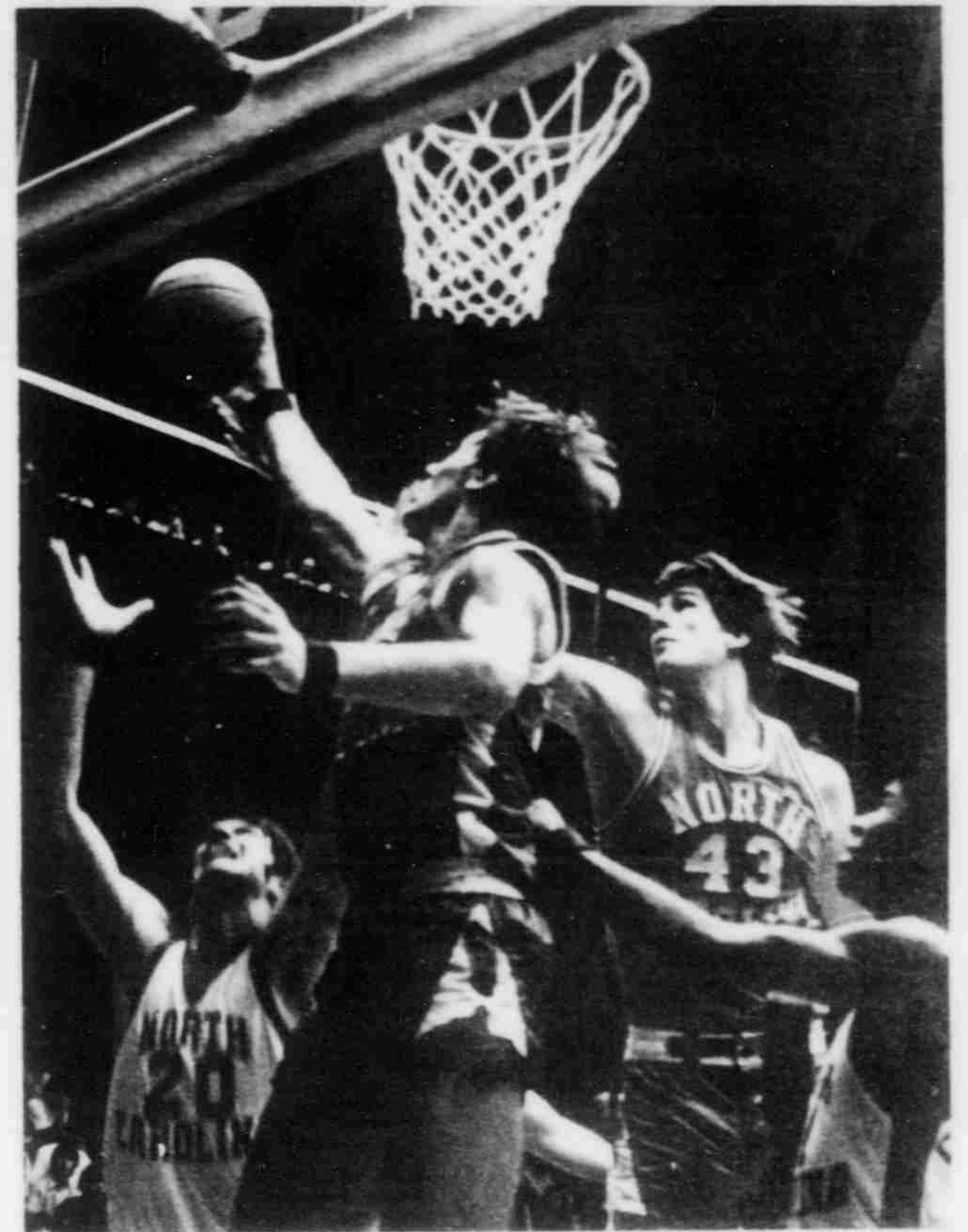
The Tar Babies' real strength however was defense, which allowed only five goals all season. Goalies Ron Yoncha, who will probably start for the varsity this Friday versus Duke, and Mike Muscal were exceptional.

"Our two goalies were the most dependable players on the team," Nelson points out. "Neither was particularly flashy, but both of them did an outstanding job all season long. John Rhodes (center fullback) was also impressive on defense, but he needs to work on his kicking style."

Forwards David Gershenson and Vern Grizzard seemed to be in the right place at the right time all season were the top Tar Baby scorers, along with Culberson.

At center halfback burly Randy Gray was impressive with his powerful kicking style, while halfback Mark Berson and forward Tracey Jones, both of whom made the varsity squad, came up with steady performances.

Nelson gives partial credit to his two coaching assistants, Tim Snyder of Cortland State in New York and Doug May of New York's Brockport State, who "did an excellent job, aiding Nelson while working towards masters degrees in physical education."

Rockingham, N.C. has been a favorite receiver for both quarterbacks, catching 19 passes for 400 yards and four touchdowns.

The Blue-Imps, too, have had their share of stars this season. Quarterback Mark Johnson has been the main cog in the Duke attack, running for 366 yards and passing for 324 in the first four games.

The Oxon Hill, Md. native has run for six touchdowns and passed for four. The leading receiver for the Blue Imps has been Jeff Christopher, a high school quarterback at Reynolds in Winston-Salem, who has caught seven tosses for 130 yards.

After missing the early part of the season because of injuries, Mike Bomgardner has come on strong, carrying 44 times for 246 yards. The leading ground gainer, however, has been Mark Landon, who has gained 417 yards in 81 attempts.
