

# AIESEC sends students abroad on work-training

This is the time of year when lots of students are planning and dreaming about a summer in Europe or in some exotic corner of the world. Many who are on limited budgets are scheming to find a job abroad to finance their trip, and still others who wish they could go overseas feel the need to stay in the States and get that all-important "experience" on their resumes before graduation.

Two UNC students have solved all these problems by taking AIESEC traineeships for the summer.

Bill Hamlet, a student seeking a Masters degree in Business Administration has been nominated by AIESEC-UNC for a traineeship with the Merkez Bankessa (Central Bank of Turkey) in Izmir, Turkey.

UNC coed Susan Oldham, a resident of Asheville, has been named to accept a traineeship in Geneva, Switzerland working for the Dupont Company.

Both of the students have been members of the UNC chapter of AIESEC, an international association of students in business and economics, for the past year. AIESEC is a student-run, non-profit organization which provides work-training jobs for AIESEC members in its 53 participating countries.

Susan's excitement about being nominated for a traineeship in Switzerland is due in part to her desire for a new perspective.

"Certainly I'm excited about the traineeship," she said

recently. "Working in a foreign country could change my perspective on many things. I hope it will be a continuation of my education, but, without the confinements of a classroom. I'm ready for the change," she said.

In addition to having a job waiting for her when she gets to Switzerland, Susan will be met at the train station in Geneva by an AIESEC reception officer, a student from Switzerland who will be responsible for her while she's in the host country. AIESEC-Geneva will also have found her lodging, helped her in securing a visa, and found transportation to her job for her.

Susan will also benefit from one of the finest AIESEC summer reception programs in the world. AIESEC-Switzerland is world known among AIESEC members for its unique and fascinating program of activities that its visiting trainees are invited to participate in.

Hamlet is also looking forward to his summer in Turkey. Izmir is on the coast of Turkey on the Adriatic Sea. Hamlet has already received a booklet describing the activities of AIESEC-Turkey, and the activities appear as "non-tourist" oriented as Switzerland's are.

"AIESEC has given me a valuable opportunity to talk to leaders of North Carolina industry, and a chance to look at and get involved in international business at a working level," said Hamlet about his traineeship.

In addition to allowing two UNC students to work in foreign countries, AIESEC-UNC has raised two jobs here in North Carolina for two foreign students to come here. A student from the Netherlands will be working for Burroughs Wellcome in the Research Triangle and an Australian student will be working for the Charlotte Observer.

## Performing Sunday Auckland Choir

The University of Auckland Choir from New Zealand will give a concert in Memorial Hall Sunday at 8 p.m.

The group's appearance on campus is sponsored jointly by the Carolina Union Music Committee and the Music Department, and is a part of the Lincoln Center's International Choral Arts Festival.

Earlier on Sunday, the 45-voice ensemble will sing at the University Presbyterian Church's 11 a.m. service. During the course of the weekend the choir members will be hosted by members of the Carolina Choir and by families of the Presbyterian Church.

The Auckland Choir is one of 16 of the world's best university choruses, totalling over 600 singers from 16 countries and five continents, which have come to the United States this month to take part in the Lincoln Center Festival. In the weeks before the festival takes place, the choirs will be on tour, and will visit a total of 125 universities and colleges in 25 states before returning to New York.

The University of Auckland is the biggest university in New Zealand and has always had a choral society. The present ensemble is an outgrowth of a much larger group, and was formed two years ago. It is directed by Peter Godfrey, a former Choral Scholar at King's College, Cambridge.

In announcing the Third Choral Festival, John Mazzola, managing director of the Lincoln Center, said "The Arts are an important bond among the world's peoples. The Lincoln Center is delighted to present this unique gathering of gifted

students as a salute to world music and friendship."

In addition to visiting the colleges, the participating choirs will visit the Kennedy Center, Philharmonic Hall, the White House and the United Nations. The choirs come from universities in Argentina, Brazil, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, West Germany, Great Britain, Hungary, India, Japan, Korea, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Poland, Uganda and the United States. The U.S. is represented by the United States Universities Chorus, which is drawn from ensembles in ten states.
