

A down-home weekend

Have you ever sheared sheep, milked a cow or split shingles? You can have your chance from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday and Saturday at Duke University's North Carolina Folklife Festival on the Duke campus.

A crafts fair, craft demonstrations and music will be the main features of the festival. All events except the Friday night concert are free.

At 2 p.m. Friday, a music workshop with the Blue Sky Boys will take place with singing of N.C. textile mill songs.

A concert at 8:30 p.m. Friday in Page Auditorium will feature the Blue Sky Boys, Elizabeth Cotten, the Blue Grass Experience with Tommy Jarrell on banjo and Fred Cockerham on fiddle and the Golden Echoes, a modern black gospel group.

Tickets, \$2, are available at the Carolina Union desk and the Page Box Office and Main Quad, Duke.

In addition to all day music workshops, Saturday's schedule includes a barbecue at 5 p.m., a square dance with Ernest East and

the Pine Ridge Boys at 6 p.m. and an outside performance on the main quad at 7 p.m. Musicians for the outdoor concert will be the Gospel Jubiliators, E.C. and Orna Ball, Byard Ray and band, Ernest East, Kilby Snow and blues singer Willie Trice.

The crafts show on both days includes demonstrations in log cabin building, shingle splitting, natural dyeing, soap-

making, canning and weaving. Willard Watson of Deep Gap, N.C., will show off his moonshine still while his wife Ora demonstrates quilting. Saturday, blacksmith Tommy Atkinson will demonstrate horseshoeing and forge work.

Cow milking begins at 3:30 p.m. both days and sheep shearing starts at 10 a.m. Saturday.

Talents to sing

Johannes Brahms' choral-orchestral masterpiece *Ein Deutsches Requiem* (A German Requiem) will be presented at 4 p.m. Sunday in Memorial Hall.

Free tickets will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis Thursday at the Carolina Union desk and in 104 Hill Hall.

The requiem will be performed by the Carolina Choir, selected singers from other campus choral groups, a professional
