If State wins, it will be the 15th straight ACC win for Holtz and he will tie Dooley's record, set in 1972. The last ACC game Holtz lost was to Carolina, 1972 in Kenan Stadium.

The scores of Mark Andrew and Bill Anderson were not counted since only the top four scores are included in the team total.


