Cinema

On Campus

"Going Places" - One of 1974's most controversial films. This French road movie is about two young punks who, in comic search of their own virility or proof of it, roam the countryside robbing, vandalizing and abusing practically everyone else in the film. (Alternative Cinema, today at 7 and 9:30 p.m., Saturday at 2, 7 and 9:30 p.m., Greenleaf Auditorium, \$1.50.)

"China Seas" - Ship captain Clark Gable has trouble on his hands when he discovers his old English sweetheart (Rosalind Russell) and his discarded mistress China Doll (Jean Harlow) are both making a voyage with him from Hong Kong to Singapore where he's to drop a shipment of gold. (Today at 6:30 and 9 p.m., Carroll Hall, Union freekick.)

"Lenny Bruce Performance Film" - The only film ever made of a complete nightclub performance by Lenny Bruce. (Shows at 7:30, 9 and 10:30 p.m. today and Saturday in Hamilton Hall, \$1.)

"The Hireling" - A Cannes Film Festival award-winner about a lady and her chauffeur. Based on a novel by L. P. Hartley, as was Joseph Losey's "The Go Between," comparison to which is interesting. (Saturday at 6:30 and 9 p.m., Carroll Hall, Union freekick.)

"Loves of a Blonde" - Milos Forman, the Czech filmmaker who rose to great popularity during the renaissance of the mid-'60s, has a gift for describing young people without rancor or self-consciousness, and this story of Andula, who works in a factory and sleeps in a hostel, was his third and "most elegant" film. (Sunday at 6:30 and 9 p.m., Carroll Hall, Union freekick.)

"It Happened One Night" - When Clark Gable removed his shirt to reveal no undershirt in this 1934 film, underwear sales plummeted across America, and men didn't put them back on again until Marion Brandt did, in the '50s. (Tuesday, Jan. 14 at 7 and 9:30 p.m., Greenleaf Auditorium, \$1.25, American Comedy Series.)

Chapel Hill

"Animal Crackers" - A flabby and static Marx Brothers film their second, in fact, and not really a movie at all since it was filmed directly from a stage play and, most of the time, looks like one. (Carolina, at 3:30, 5:20, 7:10 and 9 p.m., \$2.25.)

"The Man With the Golden Gun" - The man with the golden gun is more like it. James Bond has degenerated into a dirty old mannequin, and what used to be sophisticated humor and wit in a 007 screenplay has become a lifeless series of weak wordplay and adolescent jokes about sex. (Plaza 1, at 2:20, 4:40, 7 and 9:20 p.m., \$2.25.)

"Freebie and the Bean" - 1974 was a banner year for bad comedy, and to say this was worse than "For Pete's Sake" and almost as bad as "SPYS" is to treat it nicely. (Plaza 2, at 3, 5:10, 7:20 and 9:30 p.m., \$2.25.)

"Easy Rider" - Who remembers what they felt about this film back in 1969. And who would feel the same way now? William Bayer calls it one of "The Great Movies" but I doubt it. (Plaza 3 at 3, 5, 7 and 9 p.m., \$2.25.)

"The Life and Times of Xavier Hollander" - Ersatz Happy Hooker. Hollander has disclaimed all connection with this porno flick, which, she feels, is ruining her chances to be a serious actress. She took the producer to court, asking that they not use her name. They still do. (Varsity, at 2, 3:45, 5:30, 7:15 and 9 p.m., \$2.25.)

Late Shows

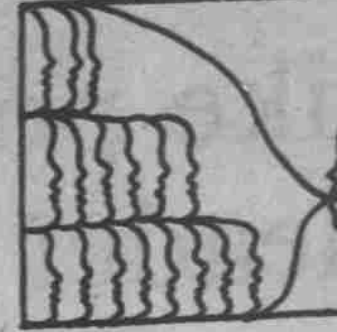
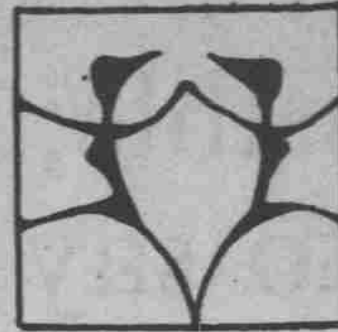
"Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Sex" ("But Were Afraid to Ask") - Once more for Woody Allen's funniest comedy, a sendup of Dr. David Reuben's dumb questions. Allen plays a court jester and a sperm, among other things. (Varsity, Friday and Saturday, at 11:30 p.m., \$1.75.)

"Reeler Madness," "Sex Madness" and "Cocaine Fiends" - Three "educational" films from the 1930's, warning Americans about the catastrophes threatening the American youths so eager to latch onto cheap thrills. Only Communism isn't mentioned. (Carolina, 11:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, \$2.)

Durham

"The Godfather, Part II" - No mere sequel, but part of an all-encompassing oeuvre by Francis Ford Coppola which he plans to combine and integrate in a couple of years, creating a massive, six-hour, once-and-for-all "Godfather." "Part II" focuses on Don Corleone as a youth and on Michael as a Don. The fore and aft of 1972's Oscar winner. (Yorktowne, at 1:30, 5 and 8:30 p.m.)

"The Towering Inferno" - An all-star



bonfire which has gotten pretty respectable reviews for the disaster genre. The story of a burning skyscraper (with people trapped therein) came from two novels, each of which was owned by a different studio. So in a spirit of detente and greed, the studios combined and poured millions of dollars into the blaze, which will at least pay off with a Special Effects Oscar. (Center 1, at 6 and 9 p.m.)

"The Klansman" - Rotten reviews for this hate-movie about the disgusting South. Richard Burton's voice is filled with magnolias. (Riverview, at 3:15, 5:15, 7:30 and 9:30 p.m., but it's the next attraction at the Carolina. So if you must go, wait.)

"Messiah of Evil" - Cheap "Exorcist" ripoff, one among many you might as well brace yourself for; they'll all play Durham, of course. (Northgate.)

"Slaughterhouse Five" - Michael Sacks is the bewildered Vonnegut dropout in this stunningly photographed, inventively directed sci-fi black comedy by George Roy Hill ("The Sting"). Some of the broader touches - especially Family Life vignettes - don't work, but the movie as a whole does. Valerie Perrine (Billy's Honey) is a dream girl. (Yorktowne.)

"Jimi Plays Hendrix" and "Magical Mystery Tour" - The concert compilation and the BBC television special, for fans of music, not cinema. (Center.)
