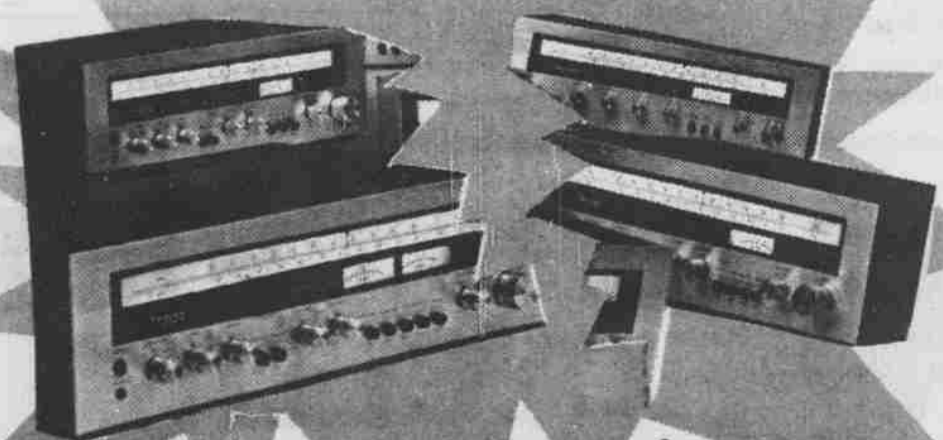

Bowers-Wolf will present a flute and harpsichord concert at 8 p.m. Tuesday in Hill Hall. Admission is free.

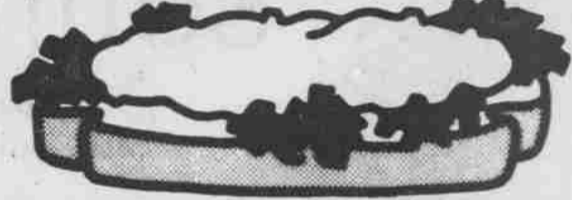
Olio

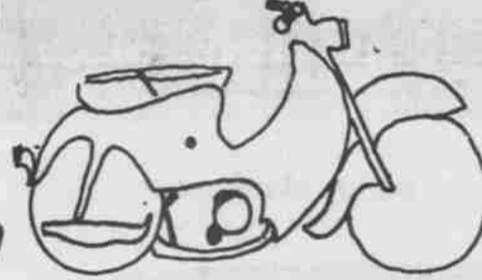
