## Netters demolish ECU minus four top players

The UNC's women's tennis team upped their record to 5-1 Wednesday, white washing East Carolina 9-0 in Chapel Hill. The Tar Heels dominated the match, leading the overall game score 108-12. It was the 31st win for Carolina in the last 33 matches, 15 of which have been shutouts.

UNC was without four of its top five players against the Pirates. Camey Timberlake, Susie Black, Jane Preyer and Nina Cloaninger were unable to participate in Wednesday's match.

The Tar Heels will travel to Williamsburg, Va. Friday to take on William and Mary. Carolina will then have a week off before a

trip to Greenville, S.C. to play Florida State and Furman. The Heels return home October 30 to host Duke.


