Mr. Anger will introduce and comment on the Magic Lantern Cycle - a chronological retrospective of the filmmaker's greatest work, including eight Anger classics and the first part of a retrospective; as the title implies, it is conceived as a magical ritual - an invocation of power. Anyone who has experienced the Cycle can testify to its cumulative effect.

The films, whose total running time is a little under three hours, comprise: Fireworks, Puce Moment, Rabbit's Moon, Eau d'Artifice, Inauguration of the Pleasure Dome, Scorpio Rising, Kustom Kar Kommandos, Invocation of My Demon Brother and Lucifer Rising Part One.
