"FELIX (THE CAT) IN FAIRYLAND" [1922] "Gosh I wish I was a fairy!" says our hero, and an aroused witch takes it from there.	"BUGS BUNNY'S 'HARUM SCAR-UM'" [1938] The first B.B. color cartoon, an Ode to Anarchy co-starring the one and only Elmer Fudd.
"ALICE'S EGG PLANT" [1924] A Disney cartoon on an Egg Layer's title, where the hens need Ex-Lax more than they need the CIO.	"DAFFY DUCK" [1949] In color, our transsexual heroine lays a Golden Egg and quickly wishes she had it.
"BARNYARD LODGE" [1928] The happy tale of a lecherous farmer who lives happily ever after with a nymph from the Zodiac.	"MIGHTY MOUSE" [1952] Mighty carries on the class struggle by dumping the fascist king into the alligator pit, while Sweet Suzette belts out arias of appreciation.
"BOOP-OOP-A-DOOP" [1932] Or the perils of America's favorite curbside hostess as she escapes the prying paws of her moustachioed circus manager.	"BUGS BUNNY'S 'WHAT'S OPERA, DOC?'" [1955] An Academy Award winner featuring Bugs in drag, with Elmer as his lover!
