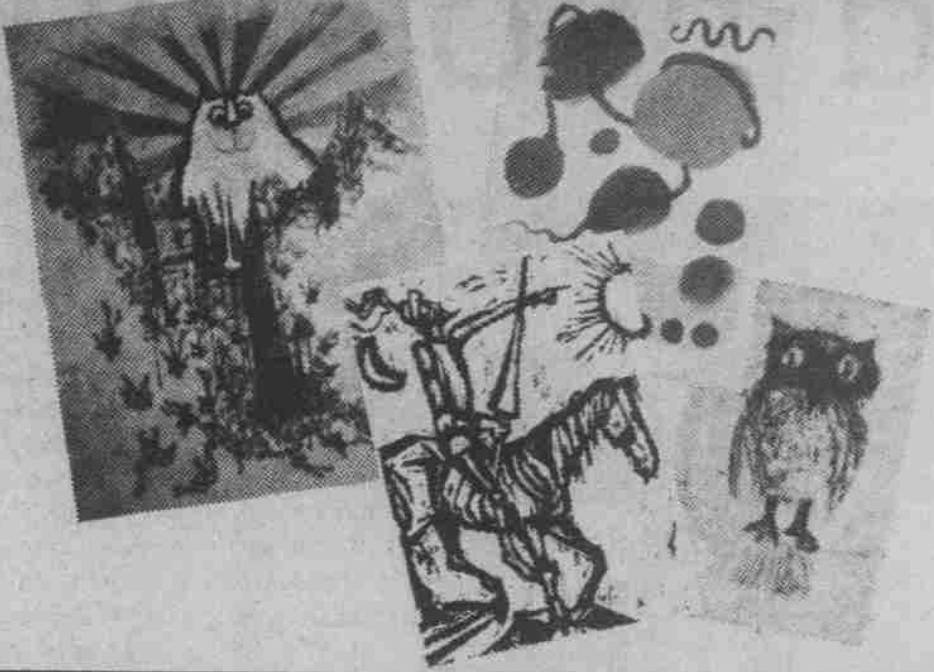

Host third round Golfers play in Big 4

Carolina's golfers must feel as if they have been beaten by their younger brothers in a game of one-on-one basketball. They know they are capable of winning, but they haven't been able to put it all together. Rising to a ranking of sixth nationally after the second spring tournament, the Heels faltered in their next two matches and dropped to 11th in the polls. This weekend, Carolina hopes to work its wildness into consistent play in the Big Four Tournament.

Play begins today at 11:30 at the MacGregor Downs course in Raleigh and moves to the Duke University Course Saturday starting at 12: Sunday, the Chapel Hill Country Club plays host with play beginning at 8:30, and the final round will be at the Old Town golf course in Winston-Salem at 12 Monday. Wake Forest, Duke, N.C. State, and UNC will be represented.

Last week, the Heels were a dismal 12th in the Furman Invitational Tournament after finishing sixth in the Iron Duke Classic a week before. "Hopefully last week will not repeat itself," said Carolina's Head Golf Coach Mike McLeod. "We're hoping to get back on the track this weekend."

McLeod plans to use Bill Sibbick, John Elam, John McGough, Bill Buttner, Mark Andrew, Kevin King, and Bryan Beymer as his top seven starters. From these seven, the Heels will use the top five scores. "We're hoping for no worse than second place," said McLeod. "Wake Forest has been playing very strong as of late. I think they have assembled the greatest golf team of all-time and it's going to be hard for them to get any better."

Inconsistent play has plagued the Heels in their last two outings and McLeod can only offer inexperience as a cause for the problems. "Our team is mostly freshmen and sophomores (Captain Mark Andrew is the only senior) so they are more susceptible to inconsistent play. We ought to have a strong tournament if we play to our potential and I expect we'll come in behind

Wake Forest," McLeod said.

The Deacons are aiming for their third straight NCAA championship this year with everyone back from last year's team's record-breaking 33-stroke margin of victory in the finals. "This year everyone recognizes Wake as the best, but we have a good team and on a given day we could win. It isn't likely, but it could happen," said McLeod.

Optimism reigns supreme among Tar Heel rooters for Big Four prospects. Fans will get their first look at the Heels this Sunday on the beautiful two-year-old Chapel Hill Country Club golf course (formerly the Oaks). Listening to Coach McLeod long enough gives one the impression that this might be the "any given weekend" the Heels are looking for.

Sports briefs

University of Maryland basketball center Chris Patton died of an apparent heart attack Wednesday. Patton collapsed about noon during a pickup game on the Byrd Stadium promenade at the school and was dead on arrival at Washington Adventist Hospital.

Patton, a 6-foot-9, 210-pound sophomore from Bessemer, Ala., was the second present or former Maryland player to die of a heart attack this year. Owen Brown, a 1975 graduate, suffered a fatal heart attack in February, also while playing in a pickup game.

The UNC track team won every event but the 800 meters and the hammer throw (which Carolina does not compete in) Tuesday to rout the University of Richmond 107-55 at Richmond. Kent Taylor set a school record of 9:01 in winning the steeplechase. Carolina finished its dual meet season with a 2-0 record. UNC competes in the State-Record Relays Saturday.

The UNC hockey club will participate in the ACC Ice Hockey Tournament this weekend at the Ice Palace in Charlottesville, Va. The Tar Heels, who are 0-9-1 for the season, face No. 2 seeded Maryland at 4:30 p.m. Saturday.
