## Allen resigns as soccer coach

The man who scored UNC's first soccer goal, Marvin Allen, will be retiring as UNC soccer coach at the end of the 1976 season. Allen has been an integral part of UNC's soccer program since its beginning; first as a member of UNC's first soccer club and later as the first and only head soccer coach at UNC since it became a varsity sport in 1947.

He joined the Carolina physical education staff in 1940. Allen will be replaced by Anson Dorrance, one of his former players. Dorrance will serve as Allen's assistant during the upcoming season and will take over the head coaching job in 1977. "I decided about three years ago that I would only continue

through this fall," said Allen. "It's time for a younger person to take this job."

"Coaching here has been a great experience. I've enjoyed every minute of it. I know I've gained more from the sport than I could ever get back from it."

Allen is a nationally known figure in soccer. He is past president of the National Soccer Coaches Association and a former member of the U.S. Olympic Committee. He currently serves on the NCAA Rules Committee for soccer.

On the state level, Allen has been a key man in the growth of soccer in North Carolina High Schools. He organized the state inter-scholastic soccer tournament and directed it for a decade.

"Marvin Allen's long devotion to soccer and his dedicated service to the Carolina soccer program is appreciated not only by the University community, but also by people all over the state," UNC Athletic Director Bill Cobey said.

Dorrance also has a broad background in soccer. As a soccer player at UNC he was an All-ACC selection in 1971, 1972 and 1973. He was captain of the Tar Heel team his senior year.

Since graduation, he has been a player and coach of the Chapel Hill Soccer Club, the current state champion. He was one of the original directors and coaches of Chapel Hill's Rainbow Soccer Program.

In accepting the head coaching job, Dorrance thanked Allen for his assistance in shaping his career.

"My playing experience under Dr. Allen was one of the greatest things in my life," said Dorrance. "He was a tremendous influence on me and helped me develop my soccer skills."
