Heel fans aren't as worried as they should be. Center Jeff Cummings is Tulane's top returner form last season. Along with 6-foot-6 Arthur Bibbs, 6-foot-11 Terry McLean and 6-foot-9 Richard Purtz, Cummings should give the smaller Heels trouble under the boards.

UNC has been led in its last three games by senior forward Walter Davis. The Pineville. N.C. native has scored at least 25 points in each of these games, and was credited with 12 rebounds against the Terps.






