The applicants are required to write a short essay showing how the proposed summer program enhances their educational goals.

Applicants must be juniors with intentions of returning to UNC for their senior year. The applicant must be an American citizen and show a need for financial assistance.

returned to the International Student Center where they will be reviewed by a student-faculty committee.


