UNC swimmers lose to Wolfpack


The UNC swimmers were dealt twin setbacks in Raleigh by the N.C. State Wolfpack, the men losing 92-21 and the women 79-51.


State captured first place in every event en route to the lopsided victory over the UNC men (4-3). The Pack's Dan Harrigan, an Olympic bronze medalist at Montreal, set a new ACC record in the 1000 freestyle and added a pool record in the 200 backstroke.

The best UNC performance was Mark List's second-place finish in the 200 backstroke. His time was just over that needed to qualify for the nationals.

Bright spots for UNC women (5-1) were triple firsts by Penny Brown and Ann Marshall. Brown won the 50 and 100 free as well as the 100 individual medley. Marshall won the 200 and 500 freestyle and 100 backstroke.
