But from Maxine Swalin, a pianist and harpsichordist who has worked closely with the North Carolina Symphony, we can expect something a little more traditional, and probably a lot more enjoyable. The program will feature music and paintings which have been chosen for correlations in style. Slides will include artists from Renoir to Picasso and Swalin's piano selections include works by Shumann, Debussy, Bach and Joplin.

Since 1946 Swalin has worked with the North Carolina Symphony as coordinator for Young Artist's Auditions and Children's Concerts. She is currently interested in the achievements of women in the Fine Arts and shares musical programs with her husband, a conductor and violinist.
