The United States also is negotiating for a general cutback on arms sales throughout the world.

The Arab nations and Israel have been upset with the United States since Carter's press conference the week of March 6. The same week, Carter said in opening remarks to Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin that Israel should have "defensible borders," a code phrase which means to Israel they can retain most of their occupied territory, rather than using the customary American term, "secure borders." Arab ambassadors immediately asked for a meeting with Secretary of State Vance for clarification. Carter said it was only a matter of semantics.

"It's hard for two antagonists as hostile to each other as the Arabs and Israelis are to think along new lines," Scott said. "They tend to go over the same ground again and again. Carter is saying, 'Let's throw some new ideas into the hopper.' If a new line of thinking is suggested, it sometimes leads to a compromise," Scott said.

Pretzel Project . . . Larry Peterson doesn't just like pretzels, he's become something of an expert on them.



ECOS to sponsor workshop

The Chapel Hill ECOS chapter will sponsor a Living Lightly Workshop from 9:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. Saturday in the Carolina Union.

"The workshop was designed to deal with maximizing individual efforts to maintain a lifestyle which is energy efficient," said Thomas Gunter, organizer of the workshop. There will be exhibits, information tables, demonstrations and discussion groups throughout the day.

Workshop topics include nutrition and organic gardening, food co-ops and transportation alternatives.

Speakers will include Robert Cole, an assistant professor of physics at UNC-Asheville and an associate with the Goddard Institute for Social Ecology.

Mark Buchanan of the Alternative Technology Association and the New Alchemy Institute will speak on wind power.

Gunter said solar-heating companies, wood-stove companies, and the North Carolina Energy Division will be setting up exhibits.

"They'll be showing how to use what

you've got available," Gunter said. "To cut back won't solve anything. We can save by not using something that's energy consumptive."

Resource material and bibliographies of information sources will be available at the workshop.

Chemicals cause cancer

Ninety per cent of cancer cases can be traced to chemical causes, according to Dr. Frederick de Serres, associate director for genetics at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS).

De Serres said Thursday that intensive study of new discoveries concerning chemical carcinogens, or cancer-causing agents, may shift the emphasis in the fight against cancer from treatment to prevention.

"It may eventually markedly reduce the incidence of cancer in the general population," he said.


De Serres was the keynote speaker in a minisymposium on chemical carcinogenesis sponsored by the Cancer Research Center and the

Department of Pathology of the UNC School of Medicine. Approximately 150 people are attending the event, including prominent research scientists in cancer and related fields.

The minisymposium is the first the UNC Cancer Research Center has sponsored since it was formed two years ago.

De Serres discussed the correlation between mutagenic chemicals and carcinogenic chemicals, summarizing the results of various research studies. He said such correlation studies have been aided by the discover of many environmental and industrial carcinogens and the development of short-term tests for mutagenicity.
