will be on court one where three-time state singles champion Cindy Johnson of Duke will face Carolina's Susie Black. UNC's other singles players will be Nina Cloaninger, Rebecca Garcia, Lisa Dodson, Hunter Dortch and Janet Shands. Besides

Johnson, Duke is expected to counter with Emily Waugh, Erin Wolf, Kathy Stearns, Theresa Donahue and Beth Brondes.






