Frank Comfort was named the new men's and women's swimming coach last week, replacing Jim Wood, who had coached the past two seasons.

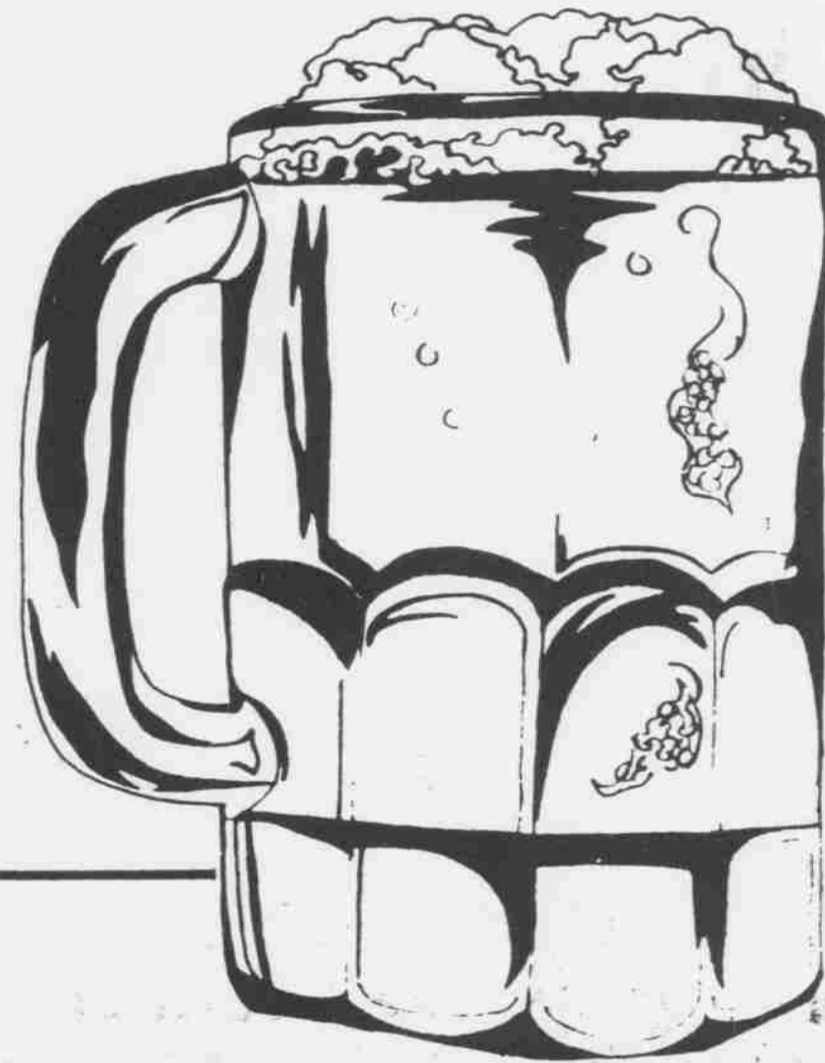
Comfort comes to UNC from Johns Hopkins, which he coached to the NCAA Division III national championship this season. He received an UNC background by obtaining a masters degree here in 1968.

The women's golf team has received one of 20 bids to the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women national championship at Kahuku, Hawaii June 15-18. Three team members — Sally Austin, Mindy Moore and Stephanie Kornegay — are competing this

week in the Southern Amateur in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

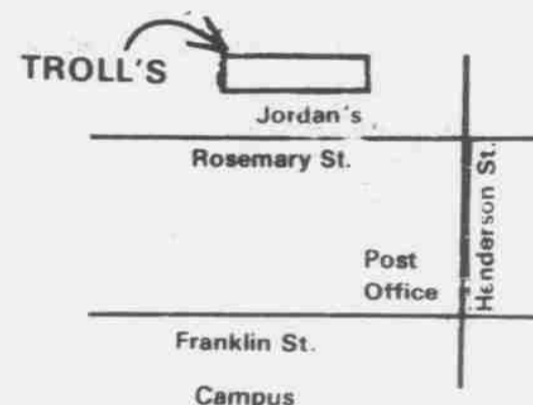
Gary Hofstetter and Kent Taylor became the third and fourth Tar Heel men's track team members to qualify for the national championship (June 2-4) during competition in the Tom Black Classic in Knoxville, Tenn., May 21.

Hofstetter qualified in the 5000 meter with a time of 14:10.9, while Taylor qualified in the steeplechase at 8:55. They join high jumper Erwin Jones and 1500- and 5000-meter runner Ralph King, who had previously qualified. King improved on his previous best time in the 5000, setting a school record with 13:56.9.



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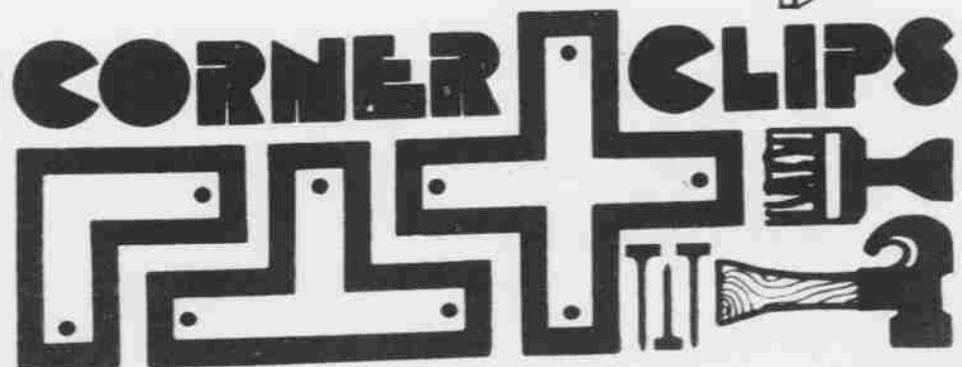
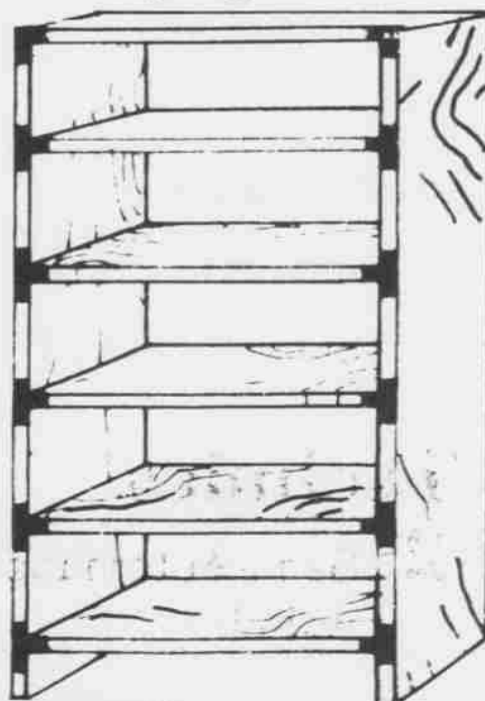
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
