# Vickery says Jones misled Board Town asks UNC to hike bus payment

The Chapel Hill Board of Aldermen plans to resume negotiations with UNC this week in an effort to get the University to increase its contribution to the town bus system for the 1977-78 year.

Charges the UNC has misled the town as to how much money it-can contribute to the system were made last week by Chapel Hill Alderman Edward Vickery and published in The Chapel Hill Newspaper. Vickery said the school had a surplus of \$200,000 in 1976 and \$110,000 in its parking fund that the town has not known about.

Claiborne S. Jones, vice chancellor for business and finance, said the money was earmarked for a down payment on a new parking deck to serve patients and employees at the hospital.

Jones expressed the view that UNC is a customer of, not a partner in, the bus system, and that the University has an obligation to meet its need for more parking spaces.

He also said that the cash reserve in the parking fund was made public to the town on April 8.

Nevertheless, the Board of Aldermen unanimously voted Monday to send Mayor Jimmy Wallace, Transportation Board chairperson Terry Lathrop and Vickery to meet with Jones and seek more funds.

Jones said Tuesday he would "be more than glad to sit down with them and discuss this matter as we have always been able to discuss matters."

Asked what he thought of a four-point

proposal issued by Vickery, Jones said he did not know what the other proposals were and "I have neither the opportunity nor the inclination to follow the town's business."

Vickery's proposals favored additional negotiations, the addition of a UNC administrator and Carrboro representative to the Board of Aldermen and a transportation system impact statement on UNC's proposed new parking deck.

The fourth point, to petition the General Assembly to delay final action on UNC's parking deck until an evaluation has been made on the statement, was dropped. The legislature has already approved that measure. Student Government director of transportation Paul Arne said Tuesday he approved of Vickery's proposals and disapproved of construction for a new parking deck.


