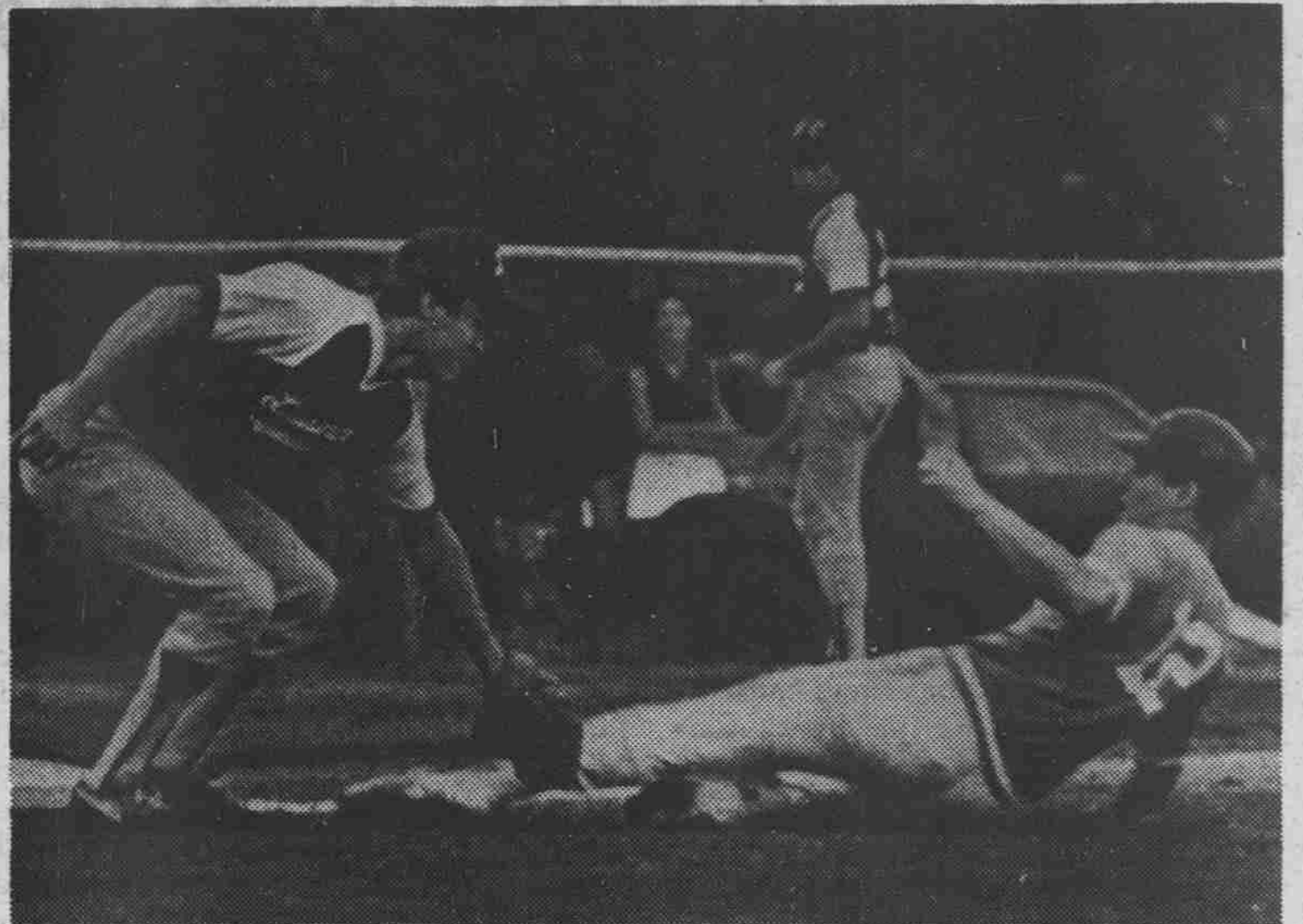
The blue-and-white juggernaut continued its mastery of the North Carolina Summer Collegiate Baseball League last week, taking four more games, two against East Carolina, one versus Atlantic Christian, and their latest victims, Louisburg, Tuesday night.

Carolina's performance right now can only be described as the best baseball being played by a college team that has nothing else much to do but play baseball. They are hitting, hitting with power, and running enough to keep most of their opponents off balance.

Their latest victims were Louisburg College, the second place team in the league. They ran Louisburg silly, scoring three runs in the second inning, and breezing to an 11-3 romp.

The Heels chased starter Kevin Niewalis for three runs and a triple before they really unloaded. Greg Robinson's triple started the third inning, and Laird Williams' single with two out scored him. It got progressively worse for Louisburg pitching before the night ended.

Leading 5-0 in the fifth, hot-hitting P. J. Gay walked, stole second and reached third on an infield out. After Mike Fox fanned, Brad Lloyd singled deep to shortstop to

bring in Gay. Jim Atkinson then crushed a pitch high in the trees in right field, about the same spot a guy named Jackson parked one back in April. You'd think eight would have been sufficient. Eight is not enough.

A triple, a single, two walks and two errors later, Carolina was one game further away from the Hurricanes.

East Carolina found that to be true last Wednesday. They danced on Pirate pitching for a 12-2 lead in Greenville, but a single by

Gay in the tenth inning snatched a 13-12 decision. In the return match, the Carolina bats took it easy, scoring only four runs. Blaine Smith fired a four-hitter, and UNC won again, 4-1.

Sandwiched between the ECU defeats was a Friday win over Atlantic Christian, 5-3.

On Saturday, the Carolina Old Leaguers, including members of the UNC College World Series teams of the sixties, will hold a contest at 3:30 p.m. at Boshamer Stadium.
