Marvin's lack of support for the average line

"One thing about being a police officer: you've got to be able to count on your superiors' support," a second-shift officer said. "If you make a mistake, your superiors should provide you with some advice, not bitch at you."

"You've got an old guard vs. a new regime," an officer from the midnight-to-8 a.m. shift said. "The old guard is anybody who was here before Marvin. There is a lot to be said for having a long term of service with the University

"But some of these guys couldn't find their asses in a paper sack," he said.

Marvin has been security director since 1972. Riggsbee has been with the police force for 15 years and Mauer for 13 years.

Many officers on the two night shifts have been with the police force fewer than 10 years. Many of the disagreements Marvin has with his officers originate from this younger group.

For example, University Police has a standing order prohibiting officers with rank less than lieutenant from talking with reporters. Yet many line officers willingly answer queries from the press.

"It's unfortunate many officers are going to the press when they have avenues of grievance within their own department," Marvin said. "Screaming to the press is not very professional."
