

Contemporary mime trio

'Newandrenewed' presented at Art School

The mime trio of the Art School will present an evening of mime Newandrenewed at the Gallery Theatre of The Carrboro Art School, 150 E. Main St., at 8:30 p.m. Feb. 3 and 4.

The evening will consist of several original mime pieces from their current repertoire, ranging conceptually from the realistic to the abstract, and will feature several new works.

Admission each night is \$2.50. Tickets may be reserved in advance by calling the Art School at 942-2041. Tickets also will be available at the door.

The members of the trio, Laurie Wolf, Sheila Kerrigan and Jef Lambdin, met in a mime school in Florida. In 1976 they moved to the Research Triangle area and began working together. Since that time, they have brought their contemporary brand of mime to audiences in hospitals, libraries, prisons, cafes, churches, theatres, schools, on the streets and on TV.

They performed at the UNC Fine Arts Festival last Spring, and have given workshops at North Carolina Central University in Durham and the North Carolina Theatre Conference last fall in

The mime that they create is of a contemporary nature. They have replaced the stylized movement and universal characters of 'traditional' French mime with

everyday gesture and naturalistic characterization. By improvizing with the audience, they break down the "fourth wall" which traditionally separates the players from the viewers.

Working for the idea that theatre can be a human experience, they let the audience identify directly, from heart to heart, with their characters. They have the unexpected to offer in the realm of silence for both hearts and minds.
