Images' loses funds member, said he felt the discrepancy was one

The Campus Governing Council voted 13-0. with two abstentions against funding the Black Student Movement's mini-yearbook. Ehony

The editor of the mini-yearbook, BernaDine Ward, said the publication was to go to the printer's today, but the book now will be delayed and distribution will take place in the

The request was presented to the new Finance Committee March 29, which referred the request to the Student Affairs Committee. The Student Affairs committee voted that CGC should not fund two yearbooks, but that the committee would approve of funding the book if it was commemorative of BSM's 10year history, which the organization is now celebrating.

The Finance Committee then reduced the amount of the original request of \$3,227 to \$2,450 and asked to see the three publication bids which BSM has received

The committee found a discrepancy between the bids and the actual request. about \$400 of which could not be explained.

discrepancy is huge. I feel they overstated the bid, but not by the thousands of dollars it may have seemed initially. I don't think they handled it well. They came asking for money without knowing what they needed. That's

Jacobson said other factors enetered into the council's decision. "I felt that it was a yearbook with a commemorative section." he said. (Of the 52-page publication, 17 pages have been allotted to BSM history.) "Also the fact that they can generate the funds themselves (The 1977 edition of Ehony Images was self-funded.) entered into the decision. The fact that they have been in financial trouble before with the loan and things didn't

Ward said she felt her organization had been caught in an unnecessary bureaucratic tangle. "I feel we have been drug through the mire." she said. "It was just a waste of time. The point was raised at the first meeting not to give money to two yearbooks. They should have left it at that. The group is upset, especially when they suggested we get funds and then they change their minds at the meeting."
