they are presenting what they feel is important. So far their batting average in terms of what is approved has been pretty good.
In comprising the original board six years ago, candidates were chosen from among the trustees of schools around the state. Sixteen came from UNC-CH. The

bill states that of the total board, four members must be black, four women and four "of the political party to which the largest minority of the members of the General Assembly belong."

To maintain a fresh representation in a given area, a constant rotation system has been set up. Upon initial election, a member is appointed to an eight-year term and may serve no more than two full terms in succession. Board members may only serve two two-year terms in succession on the same standing committee. Members are often shifted after one term in order to maintain a more balanced representation on a given committee.

To gain membership on the Board of Governors, an individual must be elected by the state legislature. Twenty-four have received degrees from one or more of the University schools, 16 of them from Carolina. Only five members were born out-of-state.

that the remarks relate to the linkage issue.

Khalil confirmed, however, that a linkage formula had been developed in the Washington talks. "Egypt has not rejected the draft treaty," he said.

A treaty incorporating a firm Israeli commitment to make progress on the West Bank-Gaza issues—such as a timetable for Israeli withdrawal from both the Sinai and those territories could draw Arab states into the U.S.-sponsored peace process begun at Camp David.

It also would help cool some of the Arab criticism aimed at Sadat since he launched his unilateral peace drive 11 months ago.

President Carter is scheduled to have lunch Friday at the White House with Saudi Arabian King Khaled, whose wealthy kingdom has considerable influence over other Arab governments. Khaled underwent open-heart surgery at the Cleveland Clinic earlier this month and will be returning home.

When he returned to Israel from Washington on Sunday, Dayan said the pact was not yet ready for signature and some items were not covered in the text because negotiators had not agreed.

The Israeli Cabinet could order its negotiators to seek further changes in the draft when they return to Washington to resume the talks.

The other major issue that U.S. sources reported settled over the weekend was the timetable for establishing full diplomatic relations between Egypt and Israel, an item that was not covered by the Camp David accords.

Dayan and Defense Minister Ezer Weizman, Israel's other top negotiator, were expected to face tough questioning from more conservative members of the 16-member Cabinet. Right-wing members of Parliament in Begin's ruling coalition have expressed concern in recent days that Israel was being pressured into making further concessions beyond the Camp David framework agreements.

Women's study offers courses

The biggest problem a student may face when trying to pre-register for a Women's Studies course is locating the courses in the spring class schedule.

Mary Turner Lane, director of the Women's Studies program, and the Association for Women Students are telling students about the courses in a

presentation at 7 p.m. Wednesday in Room 215 Carolina Union.

"Many students still seem not to know we have a Women's Studies program; this is a way to acquaint them," Lane said Monday. Lane said the problem of finding the listings arises because the courses are listed under the departments

in which they are taught and are not cross-listed under Women's Studies.

Faculty members who teach the courses and students who have taken the courses also will speak at the presentation. They will discuss the following courses: History 160, "Women in American History"; Women's Studies 50, "Introduction to Women's Studies"; Philosophy 46, "Philosophical Issues in Feminism"; Psychology 183, "Contemporary Sex Roles"; and two sections of English 2 that will focus on women. A list of other Women's Studies courses will be available at the meeting.

"The Women's Studies program is one way the University has kept up with student interest and changes in society," Lane said.

Students interested in majoring in Women's Studies or learning more about the program can do so by going by 303-C South Building and talking with Lane or by calling her office and making an appointment.

Campus alcohol education group needs rehabilitation counselors

The Campus Alcohol Education Service, a program designed to facilitate informed and responsible decisions about alcohol, is seeing applicants for four peer educator positions.

Specific responsibilities include presenting program materials on alcohol and its effects, leading small discussion groups, assisting in community development efforts and relating to other campus and

community services.

A 45-hour training course (3 hours academic credit is anticipated) is required, but the candidates selected will be paid during the training. The peer educator position requires 10 hours work per week. Pay is \$3.10 per hour.

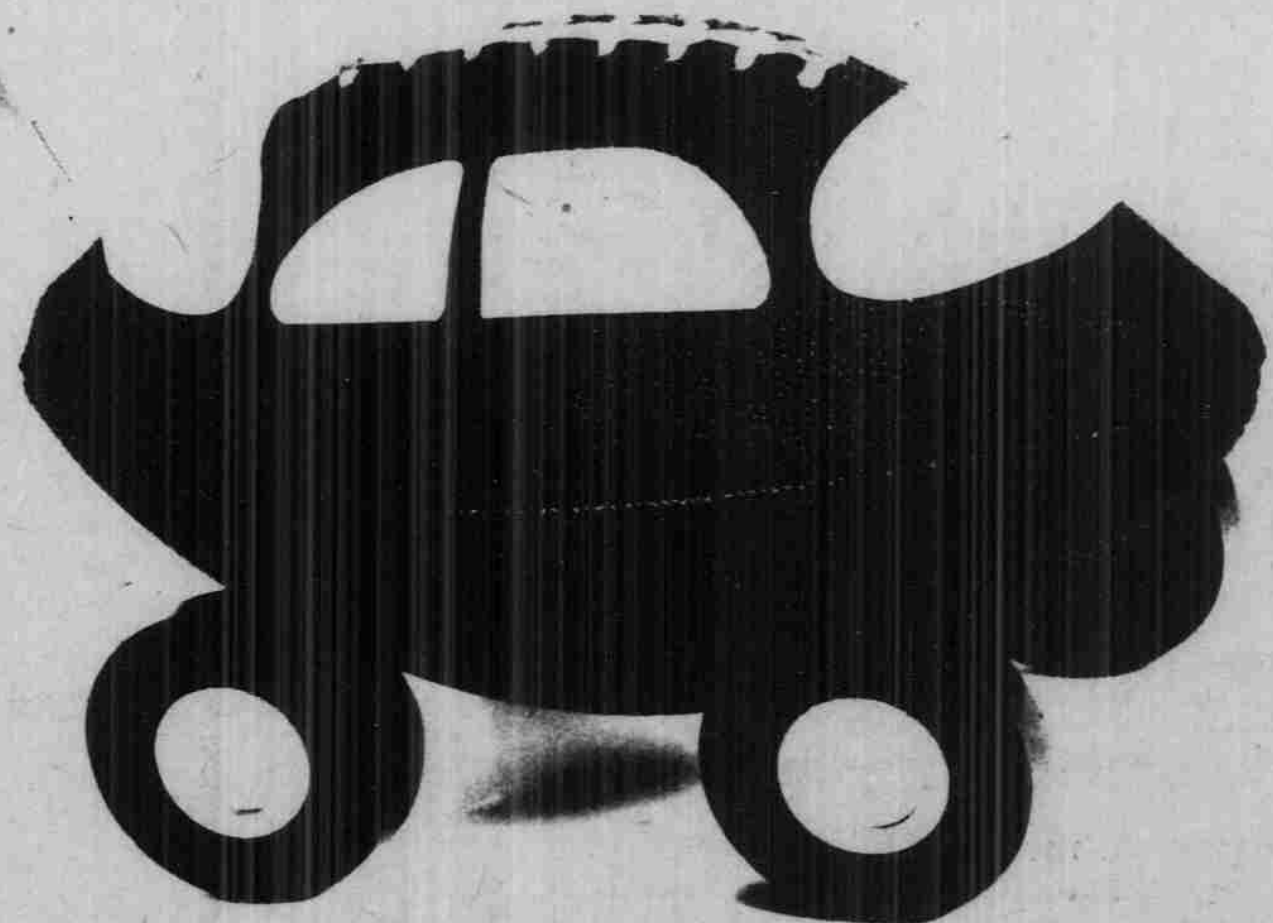
