

# Do you take this anthro major?

## 'I do, I do,' many UNC students say in combining school, marriage

Carol and Tim Brown were married after their freshman year at Florida State University. Carol quit school to work. That was 14 years ago.

Tim is back in school, working toward his doctorate in history at UNC. He has several part-time jobs and his wife is a church secretary.

Tim is among the more than 3,000 married students at UNC who must balance classes and study time as well as family and finances.

During the fall semester there were 3,106 married students at UNC—1,643 males and 1,463 females. Of these, 221 men and 446 women were undergraduates and 1,033 men and 892 women were graduate students. Professional students account for another 514 married students.

A successful student marriage, like any other marriage, requires patience and willingness to sacrifice, Carol says. "Being able to work together is the crux. When Tim and I were married 14 years ago, you worked together and there wasn't so much emphasis on doing your own thing."

About being married to a student Carol says, "The hardest part is that he doesn't have any leisure time. He has part-time jobs and he has to study in the evenings. Our daughter has had to make sacrifices, too. We have to be quiet in the evenings because Daddy has to study."

Jerry and Dwellen Joy Clark, married for five years, have the opposite situation—she is in school and he works. "He helps with the housekeeping

and the cooking. He's very understanding." Dwellen Joy says about her husband. "I love my husband, but it's hard being married and being a student too," she adds. "Sometimes I have to study when we could be having fun."

**JOHN REINHOLD**, a clinical social worker at the student mental health service, says he sees five types of student couples seeking help for their problems.

"First is the couple who is not married, but is becoming very involved," he says. "This is the couple who is living together and feels ambivalent about making a greater commitment."

A second type is the couple who has been married or living together for several years. "There may be conflicts about individual needs which no longer fitting well in the marriage. There is a crisis period in a marriage after five to seven years. When a couple is first married, there is a strong romantic attachment which may begin to level off and decline after several years," Reinhold says.

Graduate students often fall into this second category, he adds. "It may be that one student is very intensely involved in studies, so that when a so-called 'normal' crisis arises, it will be exaggerated. Graduate students may have young children too, who also have needs."

A third category is made up of undergraduates who feel their youth is stifled by marriage. "They may be realizing they need to be free, that they need to experiment," Reinhold says. "They may feel the need to do the thing their unmarried undergraduate friends are doing."

Reinhold says the fourth type of student couple who comes to him for consultation has more serious problems. "They would have problems no matter who they were married to, and one or both may be taking only their own needs into account."

The last type is the older married student who returns to college after several years of employment. "Often these students have adolescent children themselves. They may be in their first or second marriage, and there may be dissatisfaction in the marriage. It may be that the wife has kept house and the husband resents her return to school," Reinhold says.

**PAM AND JOHN** Ferrari have been married less than a year. They live in Joyner Dorm, where Pam is assistant residence director.

Because they live in a dorm, the Ferraris' expenses are cut substantially, they say. "If a couple lives in an apartment and both are in school, I don't know how they're making it," Pam says. "Prices keep going up."

Money isn't as much a problem for the Ferraris as finding time to be together. Pam is working on a master's degree in statistics and her husband works at Durham County General Hospital. "Time conflicts account for a lot of problems among married students," John says. "They have to learn how to budget their time."

Problems also arise when the student is ready to graduate, Pam says. It may be that the husband and wife cannot find jobs in similar areas and they have to choose which career is more important, she adds.

**ALTHOUGH** some say money problems are the basis of many student marriage break-ups, Milton Carothers, a counselor in the campus ministry of University Presbyterian Church, disagrees.

"Money is not what they come to me about," he says. "The underlying problem is different styles of dealing with conflict. Now, it may be that money is the precipitating conflict."

Carothers adds, "It is important that couples learn that conflict is inevitable and to learn to fight fair and constructively rather than destructively. In counseling, I try to find out what precipitated the crisis and then I try to find out what conflicts they can't deal with."

He sees most couples for one to eight sessions. If longer treatment is needed, he refers them to the student mental health service or local psychiatrists or psychologists, depending on the problem.

Sometimes the conflicts arise when one or both spouses are unable to talk about their anger, he says. He sometimes uses role-playing in counseling as a way to allow these feelings to be expressed. "It can be a safe place for couples to vent their anger and yet not let them burn each other up."

Carothers recognizes the problems students face when they marry while in school, but he refuses to condemn student marriages. "Student situations can cause problems for married couples, but I can't make a blanket statement against student marriages."

He also recognizes the problems students may face if they plan to marry as soon as they graduate. But he admits, "I don't have a crystal ball. I can't

predict if a marriage will work out or not. What I'm interested in are the conflicts they have at that moment."

**SUE CUNNINGHAM** and Jerry Castellone plan to be married this summer. Sue will graduate this spring with a degree in accounting and Jerry graduated with a business degree in 1977.

"Since Jerry graduated, he has been working and saving, so it's not like we have zero in savings," Sue says. "But I do know that finances cause a lot of problems for married people who have just graduated. You can love somebody as much as you want to until you don't have anything to eat. And then it gets hard."

Susan Jewell and Donnie Luper plan to be married this summer also, and both will continue to be in school next year.

"We've talked a lot about our plans," Susan says. Her fiancée will enter UNC's dental school in the fall. "I know that the amount of study time required for dental school is going to be unbelievable. But I know the studying has to be done."

Money will be a problem too, she says. "We were talking about the honeymoon all this weekend," she says. "We know that we can't blow all the money on the honeymoon. We're also working on furnishing the apartment now."

"The main thing is that we can't neglect each other," Susan says. "It's a sacrifice now, but it will be worth it later. We're determined to make it work. Neither one of us is the type to give up on anything."

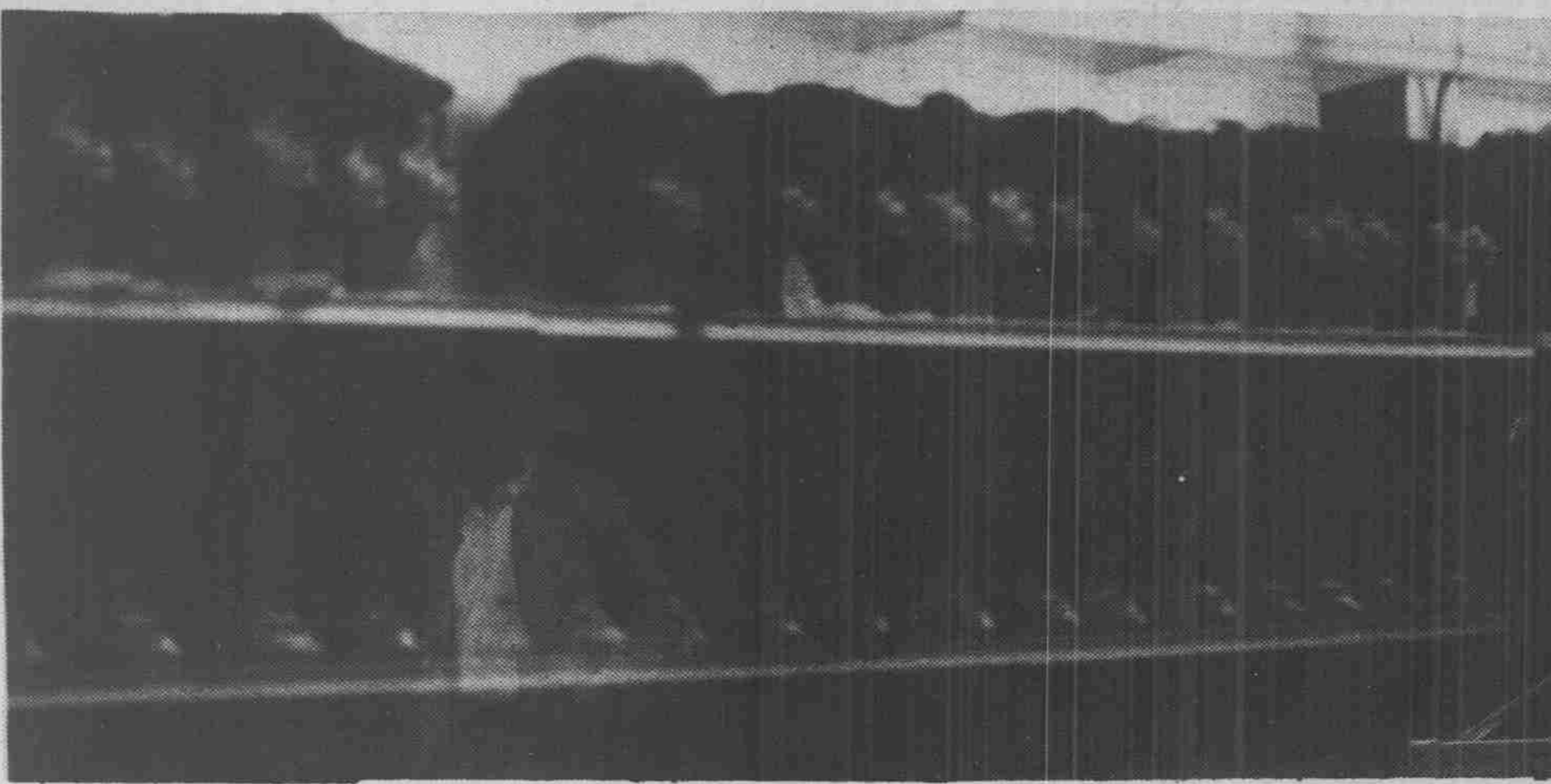
## Love notes lead to Romance

campaign in Stacy, Whitehead and Spencer. Reid Tuvim said he would concentrate in the Triad (Kenan, Alderman and McIver) and Allen Jernigan planned to go door-to-door in Hinton James and Morrison.

All three editorial candidates said they hope for high voter turnouts; they said they would have people out today reminding students to vote.

"I would guess somewhere around 4,000 to 4,500 students or 20 to 25 percent of the voters will turn out," Tuvim said. Jernigan would not comment on the possibility of a runoff election, but Stacks and Tuvim said they thought a runoff was likely.

"I think all three of us are too strong for there not to be a runoff," Tuvim said. "Any two of us put together would get over 50 percent of the vote."

The editorial candidates say they plan to take it easy today, with no major plans except to wait for election returns in Great Hall tonight.

"I'm not really sure what I can do (Wednesday), personally, but I'll have people in dorms and frat houses," Stacks

said. "I guess I'll just go to class." Polls will be open until 7 p.m. Vote tabulation will be in Great Hall, Carolina Union, and will be open to the public.

The Monday night BSM forum was the last of a two-week round of forums sponsored by Greeks, dorms and campus organizations, and most of the candidates made the best of their last public opportunity to air their views.

Mackie reiterated his assertion that Student Government should make more effort to deal with specific campus groups.

"By dealing exclusively with campuswide issues, you miss a lot of what Student Government is about," Mackie said. "Student Government ought to be dealing with the specific groups and organizations that they fund in the budget process every year."

Kelly said specific organizations are not excluded from Student Government. "It's not necessary to cater to specific organizations because Student Government is working for the student body as a whole," he said.

The three candidates for *DTH* editor said there is a need for more black input into the *DTH*. Jernigan said he would recruit more black staff members.

Stacks said he would step up the investigation of Renwick's black admissions charges.

Tuvim said he would improve coverage of the BSM.

## New tissue program in hospital benefits burn patients

Skin is an important body tissue—it holds moisture, fights infection and protects body organs. But for burn victims, that precious one-fiftieth thousandth of an inch of skin is almost impossible to grow back.

To help burn patients, the first tissue bank in North Carolina for human skin has opened at North Carolina Memorial Hospital. The bank works in connection with the North Carolina Jaycee Burn Center there.

"Growing skin is a long and painful process," says Liz Ruiz, administrative director of the skin bank. She says the skin bank can help make the patients more comfortable while under treatment.

Skin removed from people who have died recently is used as a temporary dressing for the burn patient's wounds until they are ready for skin grafting. Wet

skin is laid on the patient and peeled off every two or three days.

The dressing allows the patient's wounds to breathe and, Ruiz suspects, heal more quickly. The alternative is to use pig-skin dressings. "With human skin, the patient is much more comfortable and is less subject to disease. We are doing more research to find out the specific differences in the two," Ruiz says.

But the majority of burn patients are not able to take advantage of the skin bank. There is a great shortage of skin for the six-bed unit, and there will be a greater shortage when the 23-bed Burn Center opens next year. Ruiz says it is because the program, after four months of operation, is still new.

"We have a lot of people responding, but they are living people," Ruiz says. "We're gathering a good

stockpile for the future. Unfortunately there is not a great deal of response from families whose members died recently."

Ruiz says the North Carolina Association of Funeral Home Directors has been a great help. They and some doctors at NCMH have contacted families and procured skin donors. Unless a person has signed a donor card authorizing the use of his skin after death, permission must be obtained from his next of kin.

To collect the skin, a nurse and doctor take standard operating equipment and an electric dermatome, or shaving knife, to the body. Under conditions similar to surgery, they shave the skin from the upper torso, arms and legs.

The nurse and physician wrap the skin in gauze, place it in sterile plastic containers and store it on ice

in a cooler. It is rushed to the hospital where the skin is processed and tested to make sure it is not diseased. The skin is again cleaned and frozen in plastic bags which are placed in liquid nitrogen.

The skin can be saved for up to six months. When ready for use, it is tested again and cleaned.

Ruiz says any skin is acceptable except the skin from persons with malignant diseases, those taking steroids, those who have had hepatitis or persons with bacterial or viral disease, because they are transmitted through the skin.

Ruiz says donor forms will be printed soon and more people can donate using them. The North Carolina Eye and Human Tissue Bank is handling donations. Interested persons may get information by writing the Eye and Human Tissue Bank, 3195 Maplewood Ave., Winston-Salem, N.C. 27103.
