

Attorney cites conspiracy in Klan-Nazi trial

Federal, state and local governments conspired with the Ku Klux Klan and the National Socialist (Nazi) Party in the murders of five Communist Workers Party members in Greensboro, said Earl Tockman, an attorney for The Legal Alliance for Greensboro Justice.

Tockman made the claim at a symposium held at the UNC Law School Thursday night entitled "Sheets and Swastikas." Discussion at the symposium centered around the government's role in the November 3, 1979, slayings and the inequities the Alliance said prevailed in last year's trial of the six Nazis and Klansmen charged with the slayings. All six defendants were acquitted.

While a videotape of the slayings played, Tockman said actions of Nazis and Klansmen demonstrated that the slayings of the CWP members were premeditated.

Nazi and Klan members said they were shooting in self-defense. Tockman said Klansmen and Nazis operated in organized, military-like fashion during the demonstration of CWP members and shootings which followed.

Tockman also emphasized incidents which, he said, proved that the government cooperated with the Klan-Nazi group in the slayings:

- Ed Dawson, an informer for the Greensboro police and FBI, infiltrated the Klan; and Bernard Butkovich, an agent of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, infiltrated the Nazi group involved in the slayings, Tockman said. Both helped organize the Klan-Nazi caravan the day of the slayings, yet neither was arrested, he said.
- Greensboro police issued a parade permit to the CWP members for the demonstration under the condition that the demonstrators would not carry guns. Tockman said this was an unusual request because guns

displayed openly are legal in North Carolina.

- According to Tockman, Greensboro police gave a copy of the rally permit to Dawson, the Klan infiltrator. The permit included information revealing the starting site of the CWP's rally and the gun prohibition.
- Greensboro police were aware that the Klan-Nazi caravan was armed, Tockman said, yet made no attempts to stop the caravan or to protect the demonstrators.
- After the slayings, Greensboro police did not pursue eight of the nine cars in the Klan-Nazi caravan, he said.

Tockman also denounced last year's trial which acquitted the Nazis and Klansmen of all charges.

In protest of the court's verdict, the Alliance has filed a civil rights suit in North Carolina Federal District Court which alleges a conspiracy between the government, corporations, and the Klan and Nazis aimed at disrupting labor organizations in North Carolina.

Court rules on rape, abortion

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court ruled Monday that state "statutory rape" laws do not discriminate against men. By a 5-4 vote, the justices upheld a California law that makes it a crime for men or boys to have sexual intercourse with consenting females not yet 18.

The court's majority said the law does not represent a form of unconstitutional sex discrimination just because women and girls cannot be charged with the same crime for having sex with boys not yet 18.

The justices also ruled that state law may require that the parents of a girl who seeks an abortion be notified. The court's 6-3 decision upheld a Utah law challenged by a girl identified only as "HL," who sought an abortion in 1978 at the age of 15.

Franklin given life terms

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Avowed racist Joseph Paul Franklin was sentenced Monday to the maximum penalty of two consecutive life terms for violating the civil rights of two black joggers by shooting them to death.

About 10 marshals wrestled Franklin to the floor and handcuffed him after an outburst which began after the sentence was read with Franklin telling U.S. District Judge Bruce Jenkins, "This whole thing is a farce."

He also called the two prosecutors in the case "a trained monkey" and "a faggot" and said Jenkins was "nothing but an agent of this communist government."

Franklin, 30, was convicted March 4 by a federal jury of violating the civil rights of David Martin, 18, and Ted Fields, 20, who were shot to death Aug. 20 near Liberty park while jogging with two white women.

Besides the Salt Lake charges, Franklin faces murder charges in the deaths of a black man and a white woman in Oklahoma City and the deaths of two black men in Indianapolis.

The U.S. Justice Department is also investigating Franklin in connection with the sniper wounding last May of National Urban League President Vernon Jordan in Fort Wayne, Ind.

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Black Woman Conference stresses self-perception

Self-perception was the theme of Dr. Helen Nunn's speech Saturday before The Black Woman conference, sponsored by The Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. The lack of attendance, especially of white participants, further emphasized the problems and lack of understanding that

black women face at UNC and in the community.

Nunn, a home economics professor and the second black faculty member at Memphis State University, said that self-perception was influenced by skills, knowledge and concepts from life experience. Although black women have more opportunity today, their situation is less structured and more threatening.

"The middle-class black woman has a broader base for stability because of greater guidelines," she said. "Young black women raised by a middle-aged mother are in a paradoxical situation to be conservative or creative and original. She's struggling still to find a place in American society."

She said that black women must learn to deal with themselves and sometimes

change their attitudes to deal with the real world.

Nunn said students should look past the four year college degree to a life-long learning process. "The education system passes on the accumulated culture of the past that's oriented around subject matters and traditional skills," she said. "The goal is producing intelligent persons who can think in society and interact in ways appropriate to the circumstance."

Nunn said that black women could not mourn the trials and tribulations of being black in a predominantly white institution. She said "So what?" to this "stereotyping" and added "You can't blame others for what happens to you."

Nunn came to Memphis State 13 years ago, one month after Martin Luther King's assassination. She said she had stayed there because "black students need role models, encouragement and motivation." The audience's enthusiastic applause affirmed this need at UNC.
