

Hunt's average down in legislature

RALEIGH — Gov. Jim Hunt was two-for-three in his major requests of the General Assembly session that ended Saturday, an average not up to his near-perfect record of previous legislative meetings.

But aides to the governor say that shouldn't be taken as a signal that Hunt's influence has begun to wane, now that it is fully into a final term in office.

Hunt's requests for the legislature's first special session in a decade were a cost-of-living pay raise for teachers and state employees, a \$300 million water and sewer bond issue, and an increase in the tax on beer and liquor.

The heavily Democratic legislature, in its week's term, gave Hunt the bond issue and approved a 5 percent pay raise.

But the alcohol tax — which Hunt pushed for months, with the proceeds earmarked for the state highway program

— was denied him. It wasn't killed, but it was left in a hostile Senate subcommittee to be considered next year when, with lawmakers in an election year, its chances of passing might be even less.

Earlier when the legislature's regular session ended in July, Hunt's chief lobbyist Zeb Alley figured Hunt had' batted .999 for his season of requests, winning the gasoline tax increases, criminal sentencing changes, money for a micro-electronics center and other issues.

Alley still boasted of a successful term for Hunt as legislators went home Saturday, though with a different analogy and a slightly diminished record.

"Let's say he earned a 95," said Alley, insisting the special and regular sessions must be considered together. "I don't think it hurt him not to win the liquor tax."

Whatever the explanation, the failure of Hunt to win a major proposal such as the alcoholic beverage tax increase has been rare during his five years as governor. About the only previous loss of that magnitude has been defeat of the Equal Rights Amendment, an issue so hotly emotional that Hunt's influence proved ineffective.

News in Brief

Ministers convene in London

LONDON (AP) — Foreign ministers from Western Europe and Southeast Asia meet in London today and Wednesday for talks expected to center on the Middle East, Afghanistan, Poland and Cambodia.

Ministers from the 10-nation European Economic Community, who meet four times a year, begin separate sessions today.

An official preparing for the Common Market ministerial meeting said, "We will be assessing the prospects for Mideast peace following the death of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat."

More Haitians sail to Florida

HALLANDALE, Fla. (AP) — A boatload of Haitians landed at a beach here Monday, the first such arrival since a Coast Guard cutter began patrolling the Windward Passage to cut off refugee vessels, authorities said.

Hallandale Police spokesman Lawrence Faragher said a policeman on routine patrol noticed 54 Haitians walking toward a highway and saw a boat docked about 200 feet from a lifeguard station.

The Haitians' arrival in Florida came two days after the cutter Hamilton began its patrol of a 60-mile strait between Haiti and Cuba for boatloads of Haitians fleeing their impoverished island nation.
